**Country cooperation frameworks and related matters**

**Extension of the first country cooperation framework  
for Papua New Guinea**

**Note by the Administrator**

Period of extension:

1 January 2002 through 31 December 2002

**I. Background and justification**

1. At its second regular session 1997, the Executive Board approved the first country cooperation framework (CCF) for Papua New Guinea, for the period 1997 to 2001. At the annual review of the CCF in December 1999, the Government requested a one-year extension of the first CCF, in order to harmonize the period of the second CCF with the programming cycles of other United Nations agencies in the country.

2. The main thematic areas of the first CCF, namely, governance, sustainable rural livelihoods, environment and natural resources management, and reconstruction and rehabilitation of Bougainville, will continue to remain valid.

**II. Objectives**

3. UNDP will continue to provide support to the Government in the following areas: (a) promoting good governance through capacity-building programmes for decentralized planning at the provincial and district

levels; (b) ongoing efforts in sustainable rural development; (c) expansion of the informal sector and strengthening of its collaboration with the Government in the development and implementation of micro-credit programmes; and (d) participatory community development activities for environmental conservation and natural resource management, through support to the Government, civil society organizations and communities in the protection and sustainable use of biologically diverse national resources. In addition, UNDP will continue to support the peace-building process in Bougainville. In this context, significant progress has already been made through UNDP support towards the restoration of agricultural activities, including the cocoa industry, which have been instrumental in integrating ex-combatant youths and resettlement of internally displaced persons.



### **III. Recommendation**

4. The Administrator wishes to inform the Executive Board that he has approved the extension of the first country cooperation framework for Papua New Guinea for a period of one year, 1 January 2002 through 31 December 2002.
