### Item 2 UNDP Business Plans 2000-2003

### **Report on the implementation of the Business Plans**

The UNDP Business Plans 2000-2003, are now entering their final year of implementation. The transformational agenda set forth at the beginning of the millennium is now firmly taking hold and is visible in the way in which the organization conducts its business and aligns its resources behind its mandate.

The institutionalization of the practice areas in 2002 will ensure that the organization truly functions as a global development network, working with countries on their own solutions to national development challenges. UNDP has also made tremendous inroads in building partnerships and crystallizing its commitment to the Millennium Development Goals. Internal issues regarding staff capacity, learning and performance accountability are now more coherently integrated in the organization-wide development agenda. A huge investment has been made in information and communication technology (ICT) with the acquisition of a new ICT platform that will bring the organization much needed flexibility in the area of knowledge management and resource allocation.
