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THE SUCCESSOR PROGRAMMING ARRANGEMENTS

Preliminary earmarkings for the target for resource assignment from the core for the period 2001-2003

I. PURPOSE

- 1. In its decision 99/2, the Executive Board requested the Administrator to calculate earmarkings for the target for resource assignment from the core under line 1.1.1 (TRAC-1) and to proceed with programme planning and implementation for the period 2001-2003 on that basis.
- 2. The earmarkings have been calculated in accordance with the distribution methodology approved in decision 95/23 and modified in decisions 99/2 and 98/19. The calculations incorporate 1997 basic data or latest available estimates for that year, and are based on an annual resource target of \$1.1 billion.
- 3. The preliminary TRAC-1 earmarkings covering the three-year period 2001-2003 are presented for the information of the Executive Board in the accompanying tables. Final earmarkings to be submitted to the second regular session 2000 will take into account possible revisions in gross national product (GNP) per capita (as outlined in paragraph 9 below).

II. OVERVIEW OF THE EARMARKING TABLES

4. The preliminary earmarkings are presented in three separate tables, each of which includes additional explanatory footnotes. The content of these tables is described briefly below.

5. It should be noted, however, that the Administrator is authorized to adjust programming levels on a proportionate basis in line with estimates of resource availability for the period <u>vis-à-vis</u> the planning target (in accordance with paragraph 25 of decision 95/23). Thus, in releasing resources for programming for the year 2001, the annualized TRAC earmarkings shown in tables 2 and 3, as well as the earmarkings for all other programme lines of the financial framework, will be adjusted on an across-the-board basis, in keeping with the latest estimates of voluntary contributions and taking into account the provisions of the biennial budget approved by the Executive Board.

A. Table 1: Total TRAC 1 and 2 earmarking for 2001-2003 and the resulting preliminary distribution by category of country and by region

- 6. This table shows the total amount earmarked under the core resource financial framework for lines 1.1.1 and 1.1.2 (TRAC 1 and 2) for the period 2001-2003. As approved in decision 98/19 (paragraphs 4 and 5), this amount incorporates the transfers to TRAC 1 and 2 from the support cost lines, as well as the inclusion of "other resources" as noted in paragraph 88, footnote 11, of document DP/1998/34.
- 7. An unallocated TRAC reserve of \$30 million is being established for the period 2001-2003. The reserve will finance, <u>inter alia</u>, any adjustments in TRAC-1 earmarkings that result from changes to 1997 GNP per capita data (see section B below), and any TRAC requirements relating to net contributor countries (see paragraphs 10-14 below).
- 8. The resulting distribution of the total amount for TRAC 1 and 2 by category of country and by region is derived from the preliminary TRAC-1 earmarkings by country shown in table 2. Thus the distributions by category and region are also considered preliminary.

B. Table 2: Preliminary TRAC-1 earmarkings by country for 2001-2003

9. This table shows the preliminary TRAC-1 earmarkings for individual countries for the three-year period 2001-2002. The earmarkings are considered preliminary because, consistent with past practice, changes to GNP per capita for the base year (1997) can be considered within one year after the original calculation. See paragraph 4 of Governing Council decision 88/8; and decisions 93/24 and 92/30 in which the Executive Board took note of paragraph 17 of document DP/1993/21, and paragraph 13 of document DP/1992/22. This is done if there is a variance of at least 10 per cent from the figure originally used, or if the revised GNP per capita falls below one of the thresholds used in the calculations or to establish government local office cost (GLOC) obligations. No downward adjustment of preliminary figures are made where there are increases in the GNP per capita.

C. <u>Table 3: TRAC-1 earmarkings for new net contributor countries</u> for 2001-2003, and reimbursable TRAC-1 for the year 2000

- 10. In its decision 99/2, the Executive Board decided that net contributor countries (NCCs) are to be treated as a separate group of programme countries outside the TRAC distribution model. Hence the TRAC-1 earmarkings and other arrangements pertaining to NCCs are presented in a separate table. Any TRAC-1 requirements for NCCs are to be funded from the amount of unallocated TRAC reserve as indicated in paragraph 6 of this document.
- 11. In its decision 99/2, the Executive Board also specified that from 2001, reimbursable TRACs will no longer be calculated for existing NCCs. First-time NCCs will continue to receive a TRAC-1 earmarking for a three-year grace period, calculated at 60 per cent of the previous earmarking. This grace period also applies to partial waivers of GLOC obligations. The Board also endorsed the possible establishment of a locally reimbursed revolving TRAC (LRRT) in all interested NCCs, as described in paragraph 10 of decision 99/2.
- 12. In line with these arrangements, table 3 shows the complete list of NCCs as of 2001, based on 1997 GNP per capita data and the current threshold of \$4,700. (Revised GNP per capita data that may become available during the remainder of 1999 will be taken into account as described in paragraph 9 above). An NCC may wish to establish an LRRT, using for this purpose any provisions that exist for TRAC/reimbursable TRAC, and/or their own resources.
- 13. As of 2001, there are four new NCCs. Their respective TRAC-1 earmarkings for the grace period 2001-2003 have been calculated at 60 per cent of their previous TRAC-1 earmarking.
- 14. For the nine countries that became new NCCs in the previous period (1997-1999), the three-year grace period for the calculation of a TRAC-1 earmarking expires at the end of 1999. Since reimbursable TRACs are eliminated with effect from 2001, these nine NCCs are eligible for a reimbursable TRAC-1 in the year 2000. The reimbursable TRAC-1 for these nine NCCs is equal to the respective annualized TRAC-1 actually released in the previous period (1997-1999). The NCCs that were eligible for a reimbursable TRAC-1 in the previous period also continue to be eligible in the year 2000.

III. EXECUTIVE BOARD ACTION

15. The Executive Board may wish to take note of the preliminary TRAC-1 earmarkings provided in the accompanying tables.
