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# Extension of the first country cooperation framework for Kiribati

#### Note by the Administrator

Period of extension: 1 January 2002 through 31 December 2002

## I. Background and justification

1. At its third regular session 1997, the Executive Board approved the first country cooperation framework (CCF) for Samoa, for the period 1997 to 2001. The country office has requested a one-year extension of the first CCF, to enable the formulation of the second CCF within the context of the United Nations Development Assistance Framework and to synchronize the cycle of the second CCF with the programming cycles of other United Nations agencies in the country.

The main thematic areas of the first CCF are 2. development and outer-island sector private development. Within the framework of the first CCF, UNDP has been assisting the Government through the institutional strengthening of the Rural Planning Unit of the Ministry of Home Affairs and Rural Development, to improve its capacity to plan, coordinate and implement island development initiatives. Assistance is also being provided to outerisland communities and schools in improving water supplies and sanitation. In the area of private sector

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development, in collaboration with the International Labour Organization and the United Nations Industrial Development Organization, UNDP has been supporting the Government in developing a more integrative approach to entrepreneurial improvement through business development; small-scale training in development financing; and increased access to credit and support services for a Business Advisory Unit in the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Tourism. In addition, some policy development support has also been provided to the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Tourism.

### **II.** Objectives

3. The first CCF was reviewed in August 2000; among the recommendations was continued support for private sector development, with particular emphasis on wider participation in the private sector through legislative review and promotion of public/private sector partnerships. This area is still dominated by government-owned enterprises. The review further recommended an analysis of the poverty situation in Tarawa, the most densely populated island of the group, which falls in line with the Government's National Development Strategy, approved in October 2000.

4. Another key to development in 2000 was the completion of the Common Country Assessment process, which will form the basis of the United Nations Development Assistance Framework and the second CCF. The United Nations Development Assistance Framework is scheduled to be completed before the end of 2001 and will incorporate the abovementioned recommendations of the CCF review within its framework.

### **III.** Recommendation

5. The Administrator wishes to inform the Executive Board that he has approved the extension of the first country cooperation framework for Kiribati for a period of one year, 1 January 2002 through 31 December 2002.
