UNOPS: Risk management, reserves and surplus income DP/1997/26

A comprehensive risk and liability review has revealed that the UNDP-derived reserve formula does not adequately protect UNOPS against the risks to which it is exposed as a self-financing operational entity. The report summarizes the findings and conclusions reached, and outlines an approach to risk management and reserve funding that is more closely correlated to its circumstances and risk-exposure profile. The report and its recommendations have been reviewed and endorsed by the Management Coordination Committee.

The Executive Board may wish to approve the reserve level and funding recommendation.

UNOPS: Follow-up to recommendations of the report of the DP/1997/27 Board of Auditors (A/51/5/Add.10)
