The 1995 annual report begins with a summary of the programme and financial highlights of the past year. It then takes a close look at the new directions the Fund is taking following the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) and examines the work being carried out in the three core programme areas, particularly reproductive health. Among other things, the report also provides a region-by-region overview of the year's activities and examines the follow-up of the ICPD by the United Nations system as a whole and by UNFPA in particular.

The reports have been prepared in compliance with Economic and Social Council resolutions 1995/50, 1995/51 and 1995/56, and in a new common format agreed upon among the United Nations Population Fund, the United Nations Children's Fund, and the World Food Programme. The reports address concrete actions taken by UNDP and UNFPA in cooperation with other entities in response to specific recommendations contained in General Assembly resolutions 47/199 and 50/120, particularly relating to strengthening the resident coordinator system, the harmonization of programming procedures and cycles, and common premises and services. The reports also address the question of strengthening monitoring and evaluation functions, as well as the focus for the High-level Meeting of the Economic and Social Council in 1996: cooperation with the Bretton Woods institutions. Finally, the reports address the matter of humanitarian assistance, among other issues, analysing the response of UNDP and UNFPA to complex emergencies.

Throughout 1995, UNOPS initiated various measures to respond both to its new institutional status and to the widespread calls for reform of the United Nations system. The report provides an update on these measures and identifies actions to improve effectiveness and efficiency which the Board may expect to continue through 1996. A detailed performance report for 1995 will be submitted to the Board by the Executive Director for consideration at its third regular session in 1996.
