

## **Outline of UNDP Issues (proposed for consideration by the Executive Board in 1997)**

### **Background**

1. Executive Board decision 96/25 calls on UNDP, *inter alia*, to develop an annual work plan for the Executive Board. To that end, the decision requests UNDP to prepare for discussion at the September 1996 session "an outline of issues that could be considered by the Board in 1997, based on previous Board deliberations and the organizational priorities and objectives set for 1997".

### **Guiding Principles**

2. The present conference room paper responds to the latter request. It assumes that Board agendas which are structured around topics directly relevant to UNDP's ongoing or planned work programme will enable the Board to provide policy guidance to UNDP management on matters of current significance. The 1996-97 UNDP plan provides a new tool for identifying such topics and issues. This paper also assumes that reports and other inputs from the Secretariat which direct Board attention to policy issues, rather than managerial or technical matters, will facilitate the Board's role in the governance of UNDP. Thus, the proposals made here focus on:

- what UNDP considers will be its main organizational objectives in 1997;
- what it believes are the main challenges and issues in attaining those objectives;
- how various reports due in 1997 might be related to these objectives or be handled in other constructive ways either through the clustering of such reports under common headings or by rescheduling certain items.

### **UNDP Proposals**

3. The proposals put forward here are in the form of two tables. Table 1 distills the 1997 policy agenda arising from the 1996-97 UNDP plan and the UNDP change management process which senior management will need to consider in the coming year. The table links the priority topics on this agenda to relevant past decisions of the Executive Board and indicates the nature of the input which the Secretariat would be expected to provide. Board consideration of these priority topics, and the policy issues associated with them, would help to guide the course that UNDP is expected to take during 1997 and beyond.

4. Table 2 is a compilation of all reports requested by the Board which fall due in 1997, presented in a form intended to facilitate their efficient treatment. The table is provided to assist the Board in designing its work plan in a manner that ensures due attention to all salient items.

5. These proposals are intended to serve as an input to the discussion by the members of the Executive Board on the 1997 Work Plan. A revised proposal will be submitted at the January 1997 session, based on the outcome of the consultation held at the third regular session of the Executive Board.
