This report responds to Economic and Social Council resolution 1999/36, in which the Council called for all co-sponsors of UNAIDS "to submit to their governing bodies their proposed contribution to the United Nations system strategic plan for HIV/AIDS for 2001-2005". It serves to inform the Executive Board members of the pivotal role of UNDP in the area of HIV/AIDS and strategic areas of interventions that UNDP will focus on in the coming years. UNDP will intensify its efforts to assist countries to address the governance challenge of the epidemic by promoting the full mobilization of all government and private sectors.

This report is prepared in response to resolution 1999/36 of the Economic and Social Council. It presents a proposed substantive focus with respect to HIV/AIDS for UNFPA for the years 2001-2005 and an approach to collaboration and coordination with UNAIDS and other development partners in combating HIV/AIDS.

The annual report of the Administrator for 2000 maintains the thematic format of last year, building on the results-oriented annual report (ROAR) and reporting on the key components of the vision underpinning the Administrator's Business Plans, 2000-2003 (DP/2000/8), namely policy and focus; partnerships; people and performance. Resources and the reports from the UNDP-administered funds and programmes are addressed at the end of the report.

The year 2000 was characterized by a growing international campaign to eradicate poverty, evident in the Millennium Declaration and at the September 2000 Ministerial Meeting on UNDP. The leitmotiv is "partnerships to fight poverty", with UNDP helping to lead the way. This report will show what initiatives UNDP undertook in pursuit of this goal in 2000, with a sweeping internal overhaul matched by a renewed focus in key policy areas.

**Results-oriented annual report (ROAR)
for 2000****DP/2001/14/Add.1**

The ROAR 2000 assesses the continuing evolution of the UNDP programme focus, especially as it relates to organizational transformation; provides an overview of performance across all the goals and sub-goals of the strategic results framework (SRF) and major emerging issues, with in-depth analysis on the three sub-goals agreed with the Executive Board; reports on estimated expenditures against the integrated results framework (IRF), including progress towards the targets set in the multi-year funding framework (MYFF); and describes the methodology applied to prepare the ROAR as well as broader issues relating to the application of results-based management in UNDP.

Report of the Joint Inspection Unit**DP/2001/14/Add.2**

This report summarizes the general scope and recommendations of the Joint Inspection Unit reports and highlights recommendations of particular relevance to UNDP, noting the comments made by UNDP on the final reports with an indication of particular points for consideration by the Executive Board.

Item 10**United Nations Capital Development Fund****Results-oriented annual report of the United Nations Capital Development Fund****DP/2001/17**

As requested in Executive Board decision 99/22, UNCDF is presenting its first results-oriented annual report to the Board; it includes an update on the implementation of the recommendations of the 1999 evaluation of the Fund and the evolving partnership between UNCDF and UNDP. UNCDF performance in 2000 was satisfactory in local governance and microfinance while improvements are expected in natural resource management. The Fund also had positive results against its management sub-goal in most outcomes except for resource mobilization. In light of the positive evaluation in 1999 and good performance in the field in 2000, UNCDF will seek for an increase in its core and non-core funding as indicated in the ROAR.

Document DP/2001/18 provides information on commitments made as of 31 March 2001. Document DP/2001/CRP.9 provides an update and will be made available in advance of the annual session for review in the light of achieving the key objectives of the Board legislation with respect to resources outlined in decisions 98/23 and 99/1 and reaffirmed in decisions 99/23 and 2000/1.

Issues and principles for possible improvements in the present arrangements for programme financing **DP/2001/CRP.10**

Executive Board decision 99/2 requested the Administrator to submit to the Executive Board at its annual session 2002 a report on possible improvements of the present target for resource assignment from the core (TRAC) distribution model. The purpose of this conference room paper is to initiate the consultative process, both formal and informal, leading up to the Board review in 2002 of the current UNDP programming arrangements. Such a review is particularly timely in light of the transformation accompanying the Administrator's Business Plans as well as other changes within UNDP since 1995, when the successor programming arrangements were adopted. Issues and principles will be highlighted in this conference room paper.

The report indicates that UNOPS has encountered some difficulties in 2000 in meeting the financial targets as set in the 2000-2001 UNOPS Business Plan owing to shifting circumstances and priorities of its major overall client, UNDP. The report also provides a qualitative review of tools and methodologies developed by UNOPS to meet better the requirements of its clients. The report also mentions steps taken by the Executive Director to implement the delegation of personnel authority granted by the Administrator in 2000 and a summary review of issues relating to the establishment of posts at the D-1 level.

Evaluation

Evaluation of non-core funding resources DP/2001/20 **(dec. 98/2, para. 10)**

In its decision 98/2, the Executive Board requested the Administrator to submit at its annual session 2001 "an evaluation, in consultation with programme countries, relevant units of the United Nations system and with members of the Board, on all aspects of activities funded by non-core resources, including government cost-sharing, and on their impact on national capacities, particularly concerning the modalities applied by the United Nations Development Programme".

Since the adoption of decision 98/2, UNDP has undergone a major transformation with the introduction of results-based management, the multi-year funding framework, the strategic results framework and the Administrator's new vision for the organization. Given this context, the objective of the evaluation is to provide clear analysis of UNDP non-core activities and their value-added to the developmental mandate of the organization.
