The fifth edition of UNFPA's annual Inventory of Population Projects in Developing Countries Around the World 1977/78 and the second edition of the Guide to Sources of International Population Assistance 1979 were issued as companion volumes in May 1979 under the overall title, Population Programmes and Projects. The 555-page Inventory provides information on the population assistance programmes of multilateral, bilateral and non-governmental organizations and agencies in 123 countries or territories. The 413-page Guide provides detailed information on the kinds of assistance provided in the population field by 213 multilateral, regional and bilateral agencies; non-governmental organizations; university centres; research institutions; and training organizations. At year's end, the sixth edition of the Inventory for the period 1978/79 was in preparation.
