ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS OF THE DRAFT DECISION ON AGENDA ITEM 3 SUBMITTED BY THE PRESIDENT

## Note by the Secretary-General of the United Nations

- 1. This statement is presented in accordance with the requirements of the United Nations financial regulation 13.1 which states that no council, commission or other competent body should take a decision involving either an administrati change in a programme approved by the General Assembly or the possible requirement of expenditure unless it had received and had taken into account a report from the Secretary-General on the administrative and financial implications of the proposal.
- 2. The proposed decision submitted by the President on agenda item 3 presently before the Council, would give rise to financial implications for the regular budget of the United Nations by virtue of the present practice whereby the United Nations provides meeting and documentation services from United Nations budgetary resources.
- 3. Should the draft decision be adopted by the Council, financial implications would arise in respect of conference servicing requirements, on the assumption that there would be three sessions of the intersessional Committee of the Whole for a duration of three days each. Details of the conference servicing requirements are contained in the annex to this document, and amount to a total of \$168,100: \$53,500 for the Intersessional Working Group meeting in 1982; \$57,300 for the meeting in January 1983 and \$57,300 for the meeting in April 1983. The conference servicing requirements were calculated on full-cost basis.
- 4. Should the decision be adopted, these estimates would be incorporated in the consolidated statement of conference servicing requirements to be submitted to the General Assembly at the end of its thirty-seventh session. At that time a determination of actual requirements arising and requiring appropriation will be made.
