Information on United Nations system regular and extrabudgetary technical co-operation expenditures in 1982 financed from sources other than UNDP

Report of the Administrator

Summary

This is the latest in a series of annual reports presented to the Governing Council since 1973. It responds to decision 81/34 in which the Council requested the Administrator to continue to provide information to it on technical co-operation expenditures of organizations in the United Nations system which are financed from sources other than UNDP.

The report is divided into four sections dealing, respectively, with:

- (a) the coverage of the report and the nature of the data contained in it;
- (b) characteristics of the 1982 expenditure data provided by the specialized agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA);
- (c) data on the contributions received by the agencies in support of extrabudgetary technical co-operation activities in 1982; and
- (d) data which have been made available from other organizations on operational activities in 1982.

Detailed data provided by the United Nations, the specialized agencies and IAEA on their 1982 non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures are contained in the annex (tables A.1-A.8). These data are provided by agency, by sector, by recipient country and by source of financing. The country-by-country estimates of United Nations system expenditures on operational activities in 1982 are contained in the final table of the annex (table A.8).

INTRODUCTION

- Starting in 1973, the Administrator has been providing the Governing Council with an annual report on the magnitude and composition of the technical co-operation activities of the organizations in the United Nations system funded by sources other than UNDP. In 1981, the Council requested, in its decision $81/34, \frac{1}{2}$ that the Administrator continue to provide such data to it, until alternative arrangements for the provision of such data had been made in the United Nations system. Consequently, and in the absence of such arrangements (see paragraph 3 below), the present report contains data on the non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures incurred by the specialized agencies and IAEA in 1982. As in previous years, these entities have co-operated with UNDP in the preparation of this report by providing the data relating to expenditures and contributions contained in the annex. addition, this report continues the practice of presenting expenditures data made available by two non-technical co-operation bodies, namely the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the World Food Programme (WFP), as well as certain data on disbursements made by the World Bank and the International Development Association (IDA). Sections I to III below contain a brief analysis of these data together with a preliminary overview of the total United Nations system expenditures on operational activities for development in 1982.
- 2. The format used for the presentation of the data contained in the present report closely resembles that used in the past three reports of this kind (see documents DP/488 (part II), DP/555 and DP/1982/63). Three years ago, the format underwent extensive revisions in order to improve the coverage of the report and to ensure that the data therein could be used as an input to the annual reports on, as well as the comprehensive policy reviews of, operational activities for development of the United Nations system presented by the Director-General for Development and International Economic Co-operation (DIEC),2/ as well as to relate its data to those contained in the report of the Secretary-General on United Nations technical co-operation activities, presented each year to the Governing Council.3/
- 3. Previous reports in this series have identified other areas where improvement in reporting on United Nations system technical co-operation resource flows would be desirable, 4/ particularly with respect to the classification of operational activities of the United Nations system by type of activity, the classification of their sources of funding and the standardization of agencies' reporting on expenditures on development co-operation. These issues were studied by a joint working party of the Consultative Committee for Substantive Questions (Operational Activities) (CCSQ(OPS)) and Consultative Committee on Administrative Questions (Financial and Budgetary Questions) (CCAQ(FB)), which was convened in December 1980 and made a number of proposals relating to the classification of development co-operation activities as well as the possibility of using a single data base for the three cross-organizational expenditure reports currently prepared in the United Nations system (i.e., the present report, the annual report of the Director-General (DIEC) and the report of the Administrative Committee on

Co-ordination (ACC) on expenditures in relation to programmes). Further work on this subject was held in abeyance pending the discussion by the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) of a report requested by it in ECOSOC resolution $1981/63,\frac{5}{2}$ on the means of enhancing the effectiveness of the co-ordination of information systems in the United Nations system. At its resumed second regular session in 1982, the ECOSOC considered a report on these issues prepared by two independent experts and adopted resolution 1982/71.6/ This resolution, inter alia, recommended that a small mechanism for the co-ordination of information systems be established which would review and advise on proposals for the creation of new information systems or for the substantial modification of existing ones as well as develop, within a year, a meaningful register of development activities. ECOSOC also invited ACC to submit to it a report on the implementation of resolution 1982/71 for consideration at its second regular session of 1983. Consequently, the Administrator will continue to provide these expenditure reports pending the outcome of the deliberations in ECOSOC. Future reports in the present series will continue to report on these developments.

- 4. Starting in 1981, data on expenditures financed by UNDP-administered funds and the United Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA) were obtained from the funding organizations, so as to minimize the possibility of doublecounting of data which had been identified in previous reports. 7/ Consequently, agencies were asked not to provide data on expenditures against these funds. In those cases where data on such expenditures were reported on, and identified as such, the data made available by the funding organization were substituted for those reported by the agencies concerned.
- The classification scheme agreed to by the agencies in 1979 was followed by all agencies with the exception of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), which only complied in reporting on 1979 expenditures. In reporting on expenditures incurred in 1980, 1981 and 1982, FAO supplied data on its extrabudgetary expenditures in an aggregate form, i.e., broken down by country, but not by source of funding. Consequently, FAO data on extrabudgetry expenditures include those financed by United Nations system sources, non-United Nations system multilateral sources, bilateral sources and "self-supporting" contributions. The extrabudgetary expenditures of FAO are listed in table A.5 ("Agency technical co-operation expenditures financed from bilateral extrabudgetary contributions") since the bulk of FAO extrabudgetary expenditures has been financed by bilateral sources in the past. Nevertheless, expenditures incurred by FAO against the United Nations funding organizations mentioned in paragraph 4 were used in table A.5 and the corresponding amounts were thus subtracted from the data on expenditures financed by extrabudgetary sources. In the case of the World Health Organization (WHO), as it is subject to biennial budgeting and accounting, regular budget expenditures only cover the disbursements made during the year 1982. All WHO data reflect criteria for technical co-operation established by its Executive Board and the World Health Assembly. Moreover, the data supplied by WHO include support costs since the variety of forms of support costs - which can vary from one project to another - makes it difficult for WHO to report expenditures exclusive of support costs. Expenditure data

submitted by the International Maritime Organization (IMO) also include support costs. With respect to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), it continues the practice initiated last year of reporting of regular budget expenditures. However, the data provided by UNESCO under the heading "Regular budget" represent expenditures incurred under that organization's Participation Programme. As a rule, UNESCO considers that no technical co-operation activities are financed from its regular budget.

- I. 1982 REGULAR PROGRAMME AND EXTRABUDGETARY TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION EXPENDITURES FINANCED BY SOURCES OTHER THAN UNDP
- 6. An overview of the expenditures on technical co-operation activities of each of the executing agencies is provided in table 1, together with a breakdown by main ACC programme classification category. The format of this table has been amended this year in order to distinguish between expenditures financed from agency regular budgets, agency extrabudgetary sources, UNFPA, UNDP-administered funds as well as those financed from UNDP central Twenty-eight organizations and five regional commissions (excluding Governments, non-governmental organizations (NGO) and the development banks) reported expenditures of almost \$784 million financed from sources other than UNDP central funds in 1982, as against \$754 million reported by 22 organizations and five regional commissions for 1981.8/ order to make a comparison possible between the two years, several adjustments in the data must be made, taking account of the difference in coverage between the two years. With these adjustments made, estimated non-UNDP financed technical co-operation expenditures by 22 organizations and five regional commissions amounted to close to \$733 million in 1982, reflecting a decrease of 3 per cent in nominal terms, as against an increase of some 11 per cent registered between 1980 and 1981 and of 29 per cent between 1979 and 1980. The rapid growth of United Nations system regular and extrabudgetary technical co-operation expenditures noted in the last three reports of this kind has thus stopped, as projected in previous reports. 9/ Expenditures financed by UNFPA and UNDP-administered funds were not separately identified in last year's report; however, UNFPA -financed expenditures declined from \$127 million in 1981 to \$114 million in 1982, a decrease of some 10 per cent. Expenditures financed by UNDP-administered funds in 1982 amounted to \$61 million, down from close to \$70 million in 1981. (See document DP/1983/6/Add.4/Corr.1 for the identification of expenditures by UNDP-administered funds by fund and by country (table 24) and by agency, by country (table 25).)
- 7. The share of the five larger agencies (the United Nations, the International Labour Organisation (ILO), FAO, UNESCO and WHO in the total of non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures continues to decline. In 1980, their share was 76 per cent of the total, in 1981, 72 per cent, and in 1982, 70 per cent. Two of these agencies saw a decline in their expenditures: the United Nations with 7 per cent, and WHO with 6 per cent. The latter could be due to the fact that only disbursements are reported under the regular budget (see paragraph 5) since non-regular budget expenditures

remained at the same level as in 1981. The totality of extrabudgetary expenditures of the ILO and FAO remained more or less constant, whereas UNESCO expenditures increased by 35 per cent. In spite of the decrease in the WHO regular budget expenditures from \$159 to \$142 million, WHO continues to have by far the largest non-UNDP financed technical co-operation programme, reaching a total of more than \$275 million in 1982.

8. In past reports of this kind, the expenditure data for the smaller agencies have not yielded any generally valid trends. Nevertheless, some smaller agencies have registered significant growth rates in their non-UNDP financed technical co-operation programmes. For example, IMO, whose expenditures last year declined by 13 per cent, this year grew by 101 per cent, thus resuming the high rate of growth reported for 1979 and 1980. Similarly, expenditures of the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) grew by some 20 per cent and those of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) climbed by 10 per cent, from \$21 million to more than \$23 million, thus reversing a trend of negative growth. Contrasting with these increases, expenditures of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) decreased by some 20 per cent after a period of continuous growth. Similarly, the United Nations Centre for Transnational Corporations (UNCTC), which had enjoyed some rather rapid increases in past years, saw its expenditures decline by some 8 per cent between 1981 and 1982.

A. Sectoral distribution

- 9. As in past years, the relative size of the WHO regular budget has made the health sector the one with the highest concentration of expenditures not financed by UNDP central resources. This sector accounts for 32 per cent of all non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures in 1982 which is a slight decrease from the 35 per cent noted in last year's report. With the improved coverage of the report, which now lists all executing agencies for UNFPA, population has become the second most important sector with more than \$115 million, or 15 per cent of the total, which is about the same as in 1981. In addition to the improved coverage, one reason for the population sector's preponderance is the fact that UNFPA reports all its expenditures as belonging in the population sectors, whereas many excuting agencies previously reported expenditures financed by UNFPA in other sectors. Next in importance is agriculture, forestry and fisheries, with just over \$100 million, or 13 per cent, of the total, down from 16 per cent in 1981.
- 10. The sectoral distribution of expenditures varies according to the source of financing. Regular budget expenditures, as can be inferred from the above, are concentrated in the health sector, with some 73 per cent of the total regular budget expenditures, followed by agriculture, forestry and fisheries with 7 per cent, general development issues, policies and planning, and natural resources (both at 4 per cent), and science and technology (3 per cent).
- 11. Technical co-operation expenditures financed from extrabudgetary sources except "self-supporting" expenditures, i.e., those financed by recipient Governments, show a less marked concentration of expenditures in a few

sectors. The most important sector financed by these sources is population with 23 per cent, for the reasons cited in paragraph 9, followed in order by health, (19 per cent), agriculture, forestry and fisheries (17 per cent, natural resources (16 per cent) and education and science and technology (both 4 per cent).

12. Unilateral self-supporting expenditures continue to be concentrated in the transport and communications sector (34 per cent), followed by culture (22 per cent) which has now replaced education as the second most important sector, science and technology, and employment (both at 11 per cent), and finally education (at 6 per cent).

B. Regular budget expenditures

13. Of the traditional executing agencies (i.e., excluding the development banks, UNDP, UNFPA, UNICEF, NGOs and governments), seven reported that they had incurred no technical co-operation expenditures financed from their regular budgets: UNCTC, the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE), the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), IMO, the World Tourism Organization (WTO) and the International Trade Centre (ITC). On average, agency regular budget expenditures accounted for some 25 per cent of total non-UNDP financed technical co-operation expenditures (see tables A.1 and A.2), which is a decrease from the 39 per cent reported for 1981 (see paragraph 5 for a possible explanation). This is largely due to the decrease noted in the WHO regular budget from \$159 million to \$142 million (representing 71 per cent of regular budget expenditures), since the second largest regular budget technical co-operation programme which is reported by FAO increased from \$15 million to \$17 million between 1981 and 1982. Other agencies with technical co-operation expenditures financed by regular budgets also reported increases: IAEA from \$10 million to \$13 million, and the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) from \$520,000 to \$764,000. One additional agency reported a sizeable decrease in regular budget expenditures: the ILO from \$8 million to \$5 million.

C. Expenditures financed from extrabudgetary sources

14. Following the pattern of 1981, extrabudgetary expenditures financed from United Nations system sources constituted the second largest type of extrabudgetary expenditures with \$196 million (see tables A.1. and A.3), or 25 per cent of total non-UNDP financed technical co-operation expenditures. Compared with 1981, such expenditures decreased from \$213 million in 1981 to \$196 million in 1982, or by 8 per cent. Governments and UNDP (the latter comprising expenditures by the Office for Projects Execution (OPE), the United Nations Volunteers (UNV), the United Nations Revolving Fund for Natural Resources Exploration (UNRFNRE), the United Nations Sudano-Sahelian Office, (UNSO) and the United Nations Financing System for Science and Technology for Development (UNFSSTD)) were the agencies with the highest expenditures in this category, with \$39 million and \$28 million respectively, followed by WHO (\$26 million) and the United Nations (\$27 million).

- 15. Expenditures financed from non-United Nations system multilateral sources increased substantially between 1981 and 1982, from \$4.7 million to \$9.3 million, or by almost 100 per cent. (See tables A.1 and A.4.) The United Nations reported no such expenditures for 1981, but is now reporting some \$4 million. There is a decrease corresponding by and large to this increase in the bilaterally financed expenditures of the United Nations. The United Nations thus has the largest share of such expenditures in 1982, followed by UNESCO (\$2 million) and ITU (\$900,000).
- 16. The share of agency expenditures financed from bilateral resources in the total of regular and extrabudgetary expenditures decreased from 60 per cent in 1980 to 38 per cent in 1981 (largely due to better coverage of other sources) and increased to 39 per cent in 1982 (see tables A.1 and A.5). In absolute terms, such expenditures remained at the same level as in 1981. Of the agencies with such expenditures, FAO is by far the most important with some \$114 million, or about 38 per cent of all expenditures financed by bilateral sources. This can be partly explained by the fact that all FAO extrabudgetary expenditures are reported as being in this category, with the exception of those financed by UNFPA and UNDP-administered funds (see paragraph 5). WHO has the second largest share with \$85 million, followed by the ILO (\$27 million) and UNESCO (\$15 million). Extrabudgetary expenditures financed from bilateral sources thus remain the most important type of non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures.
- 17. Following the practice initiated in 1980, agencies were also asked to provide data on expenditures financed from self-supporting contributions (i.e., those expenditures financed by recipient Governments themselves; see table A.1 and the last column of table A.8). As indicated earlier, FAO did not separately identify expenditures in this category, which means that a complete picture cannot be had of these expenditures. Nevertheless, adjusting the data for this omission, such expenditures increased substantially between 1981 and 1982, from \$58 million to \$77 million, or by 33 per cent. UNESCO reports the highest amount of such expenditures, \$28 million for 1982, up from \$13 million in 1981, thus replacing ICAO as the agency which has traditionally been the one with the largest share of self-supporting expenditures. As in 1981, most of these expenditures were financed by members of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC), with Saudi Arabia and the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya accounting for 65 per cent of total expenditures in this category, with \$24 million and \$26 million, respectively, of the total of \$77 million. ICAO is the second largest executing agency for such expenditures with \$22 million reported for 1982, followed by the ILO with \$12 million and WHO with \$4.6 million. For reasons of space, the table showing the breakdown by agency of such expenditures is not included in the statistical annex but can be obtained from UNDP upon request.
 - II. EXTRABUDGETARY CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE SPECIALIZED AGENCIES AND IAEA FOR TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION ACTIVITIES IN 1982
- 18. For the purpose of reporting contributions, agencies were requested to classify the contributions made to them by type, making a distinction between

general contributions and unilateral self-supporting contributions, corresponding to that of expenditures. General contributions data are contained in table A.6 wherein contributions are classified by country, by non-governmental organizations, by United Nations system sources, and by non-United Nations system multilateral sources. Table A.7 contains data on contributions for self-supporting activities.

- 19. Twenty-one organizations reported general extrabudgetary contributions of \$419 million received in 1982 as against the same organizations' receipts of \$425 million in 1981. In addition, various contributions were reported for a number of additional organizations from different funding sources (mostly UNDP-administered funds), raising the total to some \$498 million, down from \$515 million in 1981. These data are comparable between 1981 and 1982, but not for previous years, when reporting, especially on United Nations system sources, was not as complete as in the past two years. The expenditures financed by UNFPA and UNDP-administered funds are now registered as contributions to the relevant organizations, since such expenditures are in fact paid up during, or shortly following, the year in which they were incurred.
- 20. Contributions by countries directly to agencies for the purposes of technical co-operation were reported by 22 organizations as amounting to \$231 million in 1982, the same amount as in 1981. Of this total, members of the Development Assistance Committe (DAC) of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) accounted for \$206 million, or 89 per cent of the total, which is a decrease of 2 per cent from the \$210 million reported for 1981. In contrast, OPEC members' contributions increased 28 per cent, from just over \$10 million registered in 1981 to \$13.3 million in 1982.
- 21. The uneven trends apparent in previous years for contributions from NGOs are again corroborated by 1982 data. The increase between 1980 and 1981 of 70 per cent has now turned into a decrease of almost 20 per cent, from \$11.6 million to \$9.3 million in 1982.
- 22. With the substantially improved coverage of resource flows within the United Nations system put into effect in last year's report, the second largest source of financing of agencies' extrabudgetary technical co-operation activities is the United Nations system itself. Agencies reported contributions of \$241 million (see also footnotes f/ through q/ of table A.6) received in 1982, which was a decrease from the \$264 million received by the same agencies in 1981. The trend of increasing contributions from within the United Nations system has thus turned into a decrease of 9 per cent between 1981 and 1982.
- 23. Table A.7 contains data on contributions received in support of self-supporting expenditures. Such contributions reached almost \$106 million in 1982, a decrease of 2 per cent from the 1981 total of \$108 million. OPEC members accounted for 72 per cent of such expenditures, or \$76 million. Of the agencies, FAO has replaced UNESCO as the largest recipient of such contributions with \$33 million in 1982, followed by UNESCO with \$21 million, ICAO (\$20 million) and the ILO (\$14 million).

III. ASSISTANCE PROVIDED BY UNDP AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

- 24. For comparison purposes, table 1 and table A.8 include summary data on UNDP project expenditures in 1982. These data conform with those in documents DP/1983/6/Add.1 and Add.4 and are provisional, as indicated in those documents.
- 25. Total UNDP project expenditures decreased by 9.7 per cent between 1981 and 1982 from \$732 million to \$661 million, the first time in several years a decrease is noted for UNDP. Non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures also declined, by 3 per cent to \$733 million (see paragraph 6). Nevertheless, the majority of agencies continue to have the larger part of their technical co-operation expenditures financed by UNDP. The only exceptions to this rule are WHO, IAEA, WIPO, UNCTC, ITC and, for the first time, the ILO and UNESCO.
- 26. As in previous years, data on World Bank and IDA technical co-operation expenditure have been incorporated into the report (see table A.8). These data reflect a proxy measure of technical co-operation expenditures financed under World Bank loans and IDA credits for the categories "training" and "consultants". Total disbursements under these categories reached almost \$731 million in 1982 up from \$517 million in 1981, and for the first time now surpass UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures. However, these data should be used as an order of magnitude only and should not be compared directly with UNDP and agency expenditure data. Apart from the difficulty of deciding what constitutes technical co-operation in World Bank expenditures, these data reflect disbursements against approved loans and credits, rather than grant-financed expenditures, as is the case with agency expenditures.
- 27. Table A.8 also contains data on expenditures incurred by two non-technical co-operation bodies, namely UNICEF and WFP. UNICEF expenditures decreased by some 4 per cent between 1981 and 1982. After having remained stable between 1980 and 1981, expenditures by WFP increased by almost 10 per cent to \$594 million between 1981 and 1982. With regard to expenditures financed by UNDP-administered funds and UNFPA, see paragraph 6.
- 28. The data on operational activities for development by the United Nations system contained in the country-by-country summaries in table A.8 are to some extent incomplete and in many cases provisional. However, much of the doublecounting present in previous reports has been eliminated which, together with the more comprehensive coverage of expenditures (including not only specialized agencies and IAEA, but also expenditures incurred by funding organizations themselves as well as Governments and NGOs) has made it possible to present, as of last year's report (DP/1982/63), a more accurate picture of the technical co-operation activities of the United Nations system. The decrease fom \$2.3 billion reported for 1981 to \$2.2 billion in the grant assistance provided by the United Nations system registered in the present report is probably a true decrease in view of the similar coverage and methodology employed in the preparation of the two latest reports in this series.

A more complete picture of 1982 expenditures on operational activities for development of the United Nations system will be provided in the report submitted by the Director-General (DIEC) in connection with the 1983 comprehensive policy review of operational activities of the United Nations system by the Economic and Social Council and the General Assembly (A/38/258, addendum).
