## UNITED NATIONS SYSTEM REGULAR AND EXTRABUDGETARY TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION EXPENDITURES

Information on United Nations system regular and extrabudgetary technical co-operation expenditures in 1983 financed from sources other than UNDP

## Report of the Administrator

## Summary

The present report, which is the latest in a series presented to the Governing Council each year since 1973 is submitted in response to decision 81/34, which requested the Administrator to continue to provide information to the Council on United Nations system technical co-operation expenditures which are financed from sources other than UNDP.

The report is divided into four sections dealing with:

- The scope and control of the report;
- Characteristics of the 1983 expenditure data provided by the specialized agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA);
- Data on the contributions received by the agencies in support of extrabudgetary technical co-operation activities in 1983; and
- Data which have been made available from other organizations on operational activities in 1983.

Detailed data provided by the United Nations, the specialized agencies and IAEA on their 1983 non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures are contained in the annex (tables A.1-8). These data are provided by agency, by sector, by recipient country and by source of financing. The country-bycountry estimates of United Nations system expenditures on operational activities in 1983 are contained in the final table of the annex (table A.8).

## Introduction

- 1. Since 1973, the Administrator has been providing the Governing Council with an annual report on the magnitude and composition of the technical co-operation activities of the organizations in the United Nations system which are funded from sources other than UNDP. By decision 81/34, 1/ the Council requested the Administrator to continue to provide this information to it until alternative arrangements for the provision of such data have been made in the United Nations system. Consequently, and in the absence of such arrangements (see paragraph 3 below), the present report contains data regarding the specialized agencies and IAEA in 1983. As in previous years, these organizations have co-operated with UNDP in the preparation of this report by providing the data relating to expenditures and contributions which are contained in the annex to this report. In addition, this report continues the practice of presenting expenditures data made available by two non-technical co-operation bodies, namely the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the World Food Programme (WFP), as well as certain data on disbursements made by the World Bank and the International Development Association (IDA). Chapters I to III contain a brief analysis of these data, together with a preliminary overview of the total United Nations system expenditures on operational activities for development in 1983.
- 2. The format used for the presentation of the data contained in the present report closely resembles that used in the past four reports of this kind (see documents DP/488 (part II), DP/555, DP/1982/63, and DP/1983/57). Four years

ago, the format underwent extensive revision in order to broaden the scope of the report and to ensure that the data therein could be used as an input to the annual reports on, and comprehensive policy reviews of, operational activities for development of the United Nations system, presented by the Director-General for Development and International Economic Co-operation (DIEC) 2/.

Previous reports in this series have identified other areas where improvement in reporting on United Nations system technical co-operation resource flows would be desirable, 3/ particularly with respect to the classification of operational activities of the United Nations sytem by type of activity and by source of funding and the standardization of agency reporting on expenditures on development co-operation. These issues were studied by a joint working party of the Consultative Committee for Substantive Questions (Operational Activities) (CCSQ(OPS)) and Consultative Committee on Administrative Questions (Financial and Budgetary Questions) (CCAQ(FB)), which was convened in December 1980 and made a number of proposals relating to the classification of development co-operation activities, as well as the possibility of using a single data base for the three cross-organizational expenditure reports currently prepared in the United Nations system (i.e., the present report, the annual report of the Director-General, DIEC, and the report of the Administrative Committee on Co-ordination (ACC) on expenditures in relation to programmes). Further work on this subject was held in abeyance, pending discussion by the Economic and Social Council of a report requested by it in resolution 1981/63,  $\underline{4}$ / on the means of enhancing the effectiveness of the co-ordination of information systems in the United

Nations system. At its resumed second regular session in 1982, the Economic and Social Council considered a report on these issues, prepared by two independent experts, and adopted resolution 1982/71. 5/ This resolution, inter alia, recommended that a small mechanism for the co-ordination of information systems be established which would review and advise on proposals for the creation of new information systems or for the substantial modification of existing ones, as well as develop, within a year, a meaningful register of development activities. At its first session, in September 1983, the ACC Advisory Committee for the Co-ordination of Information Systems (ACCIS) designated a technical panel to carry out such a task and prepare a detailed proposal to be considered at its next session. The report of the panel is scheduled for discussion at the meeting of ACCIS in October 1984. The Economic and Social Council also invited ACC to submit to it for consideration a report on the implementation of resolution 1982/71. Administrator will continue to provide these expenditure reports to the Governing Council, pending the outcome of the deliberations in the Economic and Social Council, and keep the Governing Council informed on any further developments regarding the collection and publication of such data.

4. In order to improve the quality and scope of the data in the present report, as well as to avoid double-counting of data identified in previous reports, agencies were asked not to provide data on expenditures incurred by them against UNDP-administered funds, and the United Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA). Starting in 1981, these data were obtained from the funding organizations. In those cases where data on such expenditures were reported on, and identified as such, the data made available by the funding organizations were substituted for those reported by agencies.



In interpreting the data supplied by WHO, IMO, and UNESCO the following should be kept in mind. In the case of the World Health Organization (WHO), which is subject to biennial budgeting and accounting, (1982-1983 being the last reporting period), figures reported for 1982 represented disbursements made during the year 1982 and were provisional. Therefore, and following the advice of WHO, the data presented for WHO for 1983 represents exactly one-half of the total expenditures incurred, and contributions received, during the biennium 1982-1983. In order to make a meaningful comparison between non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures in 1982 and those in 1983, it will be necessary to make adjustments in the reported data to take account of statistical differences in the data for the two years. WHO data are based on criteria for technical co-operation established by its Executive Board and the World Health Assembly. Moreover, the data supplied by WHO include support costs - which can vary from one project to another - since the variety of forms of support costs makes it difficult for WHO to report expenditures exclusive of support costs. Expenditure data submitted by the International Maritime Organization (IMO) also include support costs. With respect to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), the report continues the practice initiated two years ago of including regular budget expenditures. However, the data provided by UNESCO under the heading "Regular budget" represent expenditures incurred under that organization's Participation Programme. As a rule, UNESCO considers that no technical co-operation activities are financed from its regular budget.

- I. 1983 REGULAR PROGRAMME AND EXTRABUDGETARY TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION

  EXPENDITURES FINANCED BY SOURCES OTHER THAN UNDP
- An overview of the expenditures on technical co-operation activities of each of the executing agencies is provided in table 1, together with a breakdown by main ACC programme classification category. The format of this table is the same as last year and distinguishes between expenditures financed from agency regular budgets, agency extrabudgetary sources, UNFPA, UNDP-administered funds as well as those financed from UNDP central resources. Twenty eight organizations and five regional commissions (excluding Governments, non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and the development banks) reported expenditures of almost \$841 million financed from sources other than UNDP central funds in 1983, as against \$784 million reported by 28 organizations and five regional commissions for 1982. 6/ However, in order to make a meaningful comparison between total non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures in 1982 and those in 1983, it is necessary to make a number of adjustments in the reported data for 1982 to take account of statistical differences arising due to factors mentioned in the preceding paragraph. After adjusting the 1982 expenditure data 3/ it is estimated that non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures for 1982 amounted to close to \$829 million (\$784 million as reported in document DP/1983/57 plus \$45 million as per footnote 8/ of this document), as compared with \$841 million for 1983. This amounts to only a modest increase of about 1.5 per cent in 1983 as against an increase of 3 per cent registered between 1981 and 1982 and an increase of 11 per cent registered between 1980 and 1981, and of



29 per cent between 1979 and 1980. In interpreting these figures it must be taken into account that the coverage of the statistical figures has improved over time and that the growth may therefore overstate the real development somewhat. The adjusted 1982 technical co-operation expenditures financed from regular budgets have gone up by some 6 per cent and those funded by extraordinary sources other than UNDP, UNFPA and UNDP-administered funds decreased by some 3.6 per cent. UNFPA-financed expenditures went up from \$114 million in 1982 to \$123 million, registering an increase of about 7.7 per cent. Expenditures financed by UNDP-administered funds amounted to \$64 million in 1983 against \$61 million in 1982, reflecting an increase of some 5 per cent. Improved reporting, especially a more comprehensive coverage of the regional and interregional expenditures, has helped in providing a more accurate picture of expenditures than those in the previous years and has contributed in part to reversing the declining trend of expenditures observed in 1982.

7. The five large agencies (the United Nations, the ILO, FAO, UNESCO and WHO), accounted for some 70 per cent of the total non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures for 1983, as against 72 per cent in 1981 and 70 per cent in 1982. Two of those agencies, the United Nations and UNESCO, saw a decline in their expenditures by 20 per cent and 18 per cent respectively, while expenditures for FAO went up by 6 per cent. The decline in the United Nations share has been caused primarily by a drop in expenditure in its UNFPA-financed programmes. The total of extrabudgetary expenditures of the ILO and WHO (compared with adjusted figures) remained more or less constant - registering an increase of about 1 per cent. WHO continues to have the largest non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation programme, reaching a total of almost \$305 million in 1983, followed by \$143 million for FAO.

## A. Sectoral distribution

9. As in past years, the relative size of the WHO regular budget has made the health sector the one with the highest concentration of expenditures not financed by UNDP central resources. This sector accounts for 36 per cent of all non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures in 1983, which is about the same as in 1982 when computed with reference to the revised WHO expenditures for 1982. Because UNFPA-funded expenditures by all executing agencies, including non-governmental organizations (NGOs), UNICEF and UNFPA itself have now been included in the analysis, population is the sector with the second highest expenditure, some \$126 million in 1983, or some 15 per cent of the total grant technical co-operation assistance. As against the reported expenditure of \$115 million for 1982 it registered an increase of about 10 per cent. As also mentioned in last year's report, an additional reason for the relative importance of the population sector is that UNFPA has reported all its expenditures as belonging in the population sector, whereas, in the past, many agencies reported UNFPA-financed expenditures in other sectors (e.g. WHO under health, etc.). Next in importance is agriculture, forestry and fisheries, with some \$106 million, or 13 per cent of the total, as against \$100 million for 1982. Natural resources projects accounted for some 7 per cent of all regular and extrabudgetary grant expenditures, followed in importance by transport and communications (6 per cent), employment, industry (both at 4 per cent), science and technology, general development issues, etc., and education (3 per cent).

10. The sectoral distribution of expenditures varies according to the source of financing. As can be inferred from the above, expenditures financed from regular budgets are concentrated in the health sector (some 74 per cent of total expenditures) followed by agriculture, forestry and fisheries (some 8 per cent), general development issues, etc., and natural resources (both 4 per cent), science and technology (3 per cent).

11. Technical co-operation expenditures financed from extrabudgetary sources except "self-supporting" expenditures, i.e., those financed by recipient Governments, show a less marked concentration of expenditures in a few sectors. The most important sector financed by these sources is population with 26 per cent, followed in order by health (21 per cent), agriculture, forestry and fisheries (13 per cent), natural resources (8 per cent) and employment (4 per cent).

12. Unilateral "self-supporting" expenditures which are financed by recipient countries themselves continue to be concentrated in the transport and communications sector, with almost 30 per cent of all such expenditures, followed by agriculture, forestry and fisheries (22 per cent) which has now replaced education as the second most important sector. Expenditures on natural resources (14 per cent) occupy the third place, while culture, which was the second most important sector in 1982 under unilateral "self-supporting" expenditures, now occupies the fourth place (7 per cent).

## B. Regular budget expenditures

13. Of the traditional executing agencies (i.e., excluding the development banks, UNDP, UNFPA, WFP, UNICEF, NGOs and Governments), seven reported that they had incurred no technical co-operation expenditures financed from their regular budgets: the United Nations Centre on Transnational Corporations (UNCTC), the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (ECE), the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), the International Maritime Organization (IMO), the World Tourism Organization (WTO) and the International Trade Centre (ITC). On the average, agency regular budget expenditures accounted for some 31 per cent of total non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures (see tables A.1 and A.2), as against 29 per cent for 1982 calculated with reference to the adjusted figures (see paragraph 5 for an explanation). Due to the biennial system of budgeting and accounting of WHO, the adjusted expenditure for 1982 corresponds to the amount of \$184,810 reported for 1983. However, with the exception of ECWA, HABITAT and UPU, which have reported decreased expenditures, all other agencies have reported higher expenditures for 1983 compared to 1982. The expenditures for FAO, the second largest regular budget technical co-operation programme after WHO, increased from \$17 million in 1982 to \$23 million in 1983. The following agencies also reported substantial increases in their regular programme expenditures: the ILO from \$5 million to \$9 million; WMO from \$3 million to \$5 million; ITU from \$1 million to \$3 million; UNIDO from \$3 million to \$4 million; ECLA from \$5 million to \$12 million; ESCAP from \$9 million to \$12 million; and WIPO from \$8 million to \$9 million. The expenditures for IAEA went up to \$17 million from \$13 million in 1982. Substantially improved reporting and more comprehensive coverage of expenditures, especially in respect of regional and interregional programmes funded out of regular budgets, have helped in providing a better picture of the expenditure data.

## C. Expenditures financed from extrabudgetary sources

14. Hitherto, FAO had been reporting on its extrabudgetary expenditures in an aggregate form, i.e. broken down by country but not by the source of funding as per classification scheme agreed to by the agencies in 1979. Consequently, FAO data on extrabudgetary expenditures was being reported under "agency technical co-operation expenditures financed from bilateral extrabudgetary contributions", which included items financed from United Nations system sources, non-United Nations system multilateral sources, and self-supporting contributions. For 1983 FAO has provided information in accordance with the breakdown of the agreed classification scheme. In order to allow a valid comparison between such expenditures for 1983 as compared to those for 1982, some adjustment will have to be made in the reported expenditures. 15. As in previous years, extrabudgetary expenditures financed from United Nations system sources constituted the second largest type of extrabudgetary expenditures, and amounted to \$216 million (see tables A.1 and A.3) for 1983, accounting for some 26 per cent of the total non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures. However, in order to make a valid comparison with the expenditures incurred during 1982, adjustments in the data must be made for the factors mentioned in the preceding paragraph. With these adjustments made, estimated extrabudgetary expenditures financed from United Nations

system sources amounted to close to \$208 million in 1983, as against the reported expenditure of \$196 million for 1982, reflecting an overall increase of 6 per cent, thereby reversing the trend observed in 1982 when such expenditures decreased by about 8 per cent. Governments and UNDP (the latter comprising expenditures by the Office for Projects Execution (OPE), United Nations Volunteers (UNV), the United Nations Revolving Fund for Natural Resources Exploration (UNRFNRE), the United Nations Sudano-Sahelian Office (UNSO) and the United Nations Financing System for Science and Technology for Development (UNFSSTD) had the highest expenditures financed from sources within the United Nations system, with \$44 million and \$33 million respectively, followed by WHO (\$30 million) and the United Nations (\$22 million).

16. Expenditures financed from non-United Nations system multilateral sources amounted to some \$20 million for 1983 (see tables A.1 and A.4). After making adjustment for expenditures of \$15.8 million reported by FAO for the first time during this year, the comparable figures for 1983 would amount to \$4 million. After accounting for an amount of \$4.3 million, which was reported during 1982 by the United Nations under this heading rather than under United Nations system sources, the final figure for 1982 would be \$5 million. Thus, in comparable terms, expenditures for 1983 have declined to \$4 million from \$5 million. Disregarding the amount reported by FAO, one-half of the total was spent by UNESCO. ITU reported a very substantial drop in its activities financed from non-United Nations multilateral resources, from \$0.9 million in 1982 to \$0.2 million in 1983. WHO, UNIDO, and ICAO have also reported lower expenditures for 1983. However, IMO has reported an expenditure of little more than \$0.3 million in 1983, as against nil expenditures for 1982.




17. The share of agency expenditures financed from bilateral resources in the total of regular and extrabudgetary sources decreased from 37 per cent in 1982 to 30 per cent in 1983 (see tables A.1 and A.5). After making adjustments due to the change in the reporting procedures by FAO, expenditures financed from bilateral resources went up by some 1.6 per cent as compared to 1982 expenditures. ITU, WMO, IMO, ITC and Habitat reported a drop in their expenditures. Of the agencies with such expenditures, WHO is by far the most important with some \$86 million, or about 34 per cent of all expenditures, financed by bilateral resources. FAO, which has reported an expenditure of \$62 million, now occupies the second place, and accounts for some 24 per cent of such expenditures. The ILO has the third largest share with \$26 million, followed by UNESCO (\$19 million) and UNIDO (\$15 million). Extrabudgetary expenditures financed from bilateral sources remain the most important type of non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures.

18. As in previous years, agencies were also asked to provide data on expenditures financed from self-supporting contributions (i.e., those expenditures financed by recipient Governments themselves; see table A.1 and the last column of table A.8). The reported expenditures for 1983 amounted to \$92 million. As mentioned earlier, FAO identified its expenditures according to the agreed classification for the first time during this year and reported an expenditure of some \$34 million financed from self-supporting contributions. After adjusting for this submission, expenditures under this category went down by about 24 per cent vis-à-vis those for 1982. FAO reported the highest amount of such expenditures, \$34 million for 1983.

UNESCO, whose expenditures for 1983 has gone down to \$11 million from the reported expenditure of \$28 million in 1982 now holds the third place among



traditional executing agencies. ICAO, with an expenditure of \$23 million, continues to be the second largest executing agency for such expenditures. The ILO has also reported a big drop in its expenditure with \$7 million in 1983 as against \$12 million in 1982. As in 1982, most of these expenditures were financed by members of the organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC), with Saudi Arabia and the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya accounting for 61 per cent of total expenditures in this category, as against the reported figure of 65 per cent in 1982. For reasons of space, the table showing the breakdown by agency of such expenditures is not included in the statistical annex but can be obtained from UNDP upon request.



- 19. For purposes of reporting contributions, agencies were requested to classify the contributions made to them by type, making a distinction between general contributions and unilateral "self-supporting" contributions, corresponding to that of expenditures. General contributions data are contained in table A.6, classifying the sources of contributions by country, by United Nations system sources, by non-United Nations system multilateral sources and by other miscellaneous sources. Table A.7 contains contributions for "self-supporting" activities.
- 20. Twenty one organizations reported general extrabudgetary contributions of \$372 million received in 1983 as against the same organizations' receipts of \$419 million in 1982. In addition, various contributions were reported for a





number of additional organizations from different funding sources (mostly UNDP-administered funds), raising the total to some \$465 million, down from \$498 million in 1982. The expenditures financed by UNFPA and UNDP-administered funds are now registered as contributions to the relevant organizations, since such expenditures are in fact paid up during, or shortly following, the year in which they were incurred.

- 21. Contributions by countries directly to agencies for the purposes of technical co-operation were reported by 21 organizations as amounting to \$202 million in 1983, as against \$231 million for 1982. FAO, the ILO, UNESCO and WMO reported substantial reductions in their contributions. The contribution from members of the Development Assistance Committee (DAC) of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) decreased from \$206 million in 1982 to \$166 million in 1983. Also, OPEC members' contribution decreased from \$13.3 million in 1982 to \$11 million in 1983.
- 22. An increase, however, has been observed in the contributions received by agencies from NGOs, from \$9.3 million received in 1982 to close to \$11.8 million received in 1983: an increase of about 27 per cent. This may be due to better reporting by WHO, whose contributions from NGOs increased from \$6.4 million in 1982 to \$9.4 million in 1983.
- 23. As also observed during the previous year, the second largest source of financing of agencies' extrabudgetary technical co-operation activities continues to be the United Nations system itself. Agencies reported contributions of \$216 million (see also footnotes to table A.6) received in 1983, which was a decrease from the \$241 million received by the same agencies in 1982, a decrease of 9 per cent between 1982 and 1983. However, contributions from non-United Nations multilateral sources have risen from \$17 million in 1982 to \$32 million in 1983.

24. In conformity with the practice of previous reports, table A.7 contains data on the contributions made to the United Nations system for "self-supporting" technical co-operation activities. Such contributions, which had reached almost \$108 million in 1981, and declined to \$106 million in 1982, went down again in 1983 and amounted to \$80 million only. The contributions by the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya slid to \$12 million in 1983 from \$22 million in 1982 and those by Iraq to \$5 million in 1983 from \$12 million in 1982. There was a small fall in the case of Saudi Arabia as well - from \$39 million in 1982 to \$37 million in 1983. However, some countries increased, though marginally, their contributions for self-supporting technical co-operation activities. FAO was the largest recipient of such funds, followed by ICAO, the ILO, UNESCO and UNIDO, in descending order.

## III. ASSISTANCE PROVIDED BY UNDP AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

25. For comparison purposes, tables 1 and A.8 include summary data on UNDP project expenditures in 1983. These data conform with those in documents DP/1983/6/Add.1 and Add.4. and are provisional, as indicated in those documents.

26. Total UNDP project expenditures decreased by 15 per cent between 1982 and 1983, from \$661 million to \$560 million, as against a decrease of some 9 per cent observed in 1982. Non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures, however, went up marginally by 1.5 per cent, bringing such expenditures to \$841 million for 1983 (see paragraph 6). Nevertheless, the majority of agencies continue to have the larger part of their technical co-operation

expenditures financed by UNDP. The exceptions to this rule are WHO, IAEA, WIPO, UNCTC, ITC, the ILO, UNESCO and, for the first time, FAO. 27. As in previous years, data on World Bank and IDA technical co-operation expenditures have been incorporated into the report (see table A.8). These data reflect a proxy measure of technical co-operation expenditures financed under World Bank loans and IDA credits for the categories "training" and "consultants". Total disbursements under these categories reached almost \$873 million in 1983, up from \$731 million in 1982 and, as in 1982, surpasses UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures. However, caution in the use of these data is advised, since these data should be used as only an indication of the magnitude and should not be compared directly with UNDP and agency expenditure data. Apart from the difficulty of deciding what constitutes technical co-operation in World Bank expenditures, these data reflect disbursements against approved loans and credits, rather than grant-financed expenditures, as is the case with agency expenditures. 28. Table A.8 also contains data on expenditures incurred by two non-technical co-operation bodies, namely UNICEF and WFP. Expenditures by WFP continued to maintain the momentum regained in 1982 and have gone up to \$629 million in 1983, thereby registering an increase of about 6 per cent from \$594 million in 1982. The expenditures by UNICEF amounted to \$246 million in 1983, while the corresponding figure for 1982 was \$205 million.

29. The data on operational activities for development by the United Nations system contained in the country-by-country summaries in table A.8 are, to some extent, incomplete and, in many cases, provisional. However, much of the doublecounting present in previous reports has been eliminated which, together

with the more comprehensive coverage of expenditures (including not only specialized agencies and IAEA, but also expenditures incurred by funding organizations themselves as well as Governments and NGOs) has made it possible to present a more accurate picture of the technical co-operation activities of the United Nations system. The total grant assistance in the amount of \$2.2 billion for 1983 continues to be at the level of \$2.2 billion reported for 1982 and probably reflects a true picture in view of the similar coverage and methodology employed in the preparation of the recent reports in this series.

30. A more complete picture of 1983 expenditures on operational activities for development of the United Nations system will be provided in the report submitted by the Director-General, DIEC, in connection with the 1984 comprehensive policy review of operational activities of the United Nations system by the Economic and Social Council and the General Assembly (A/38/258, addendum).


