Note by the Administrator

Summary

In accordance with established practice, the attention of the Governing Council is drawn to resolutions and decisions adopted in 1985 by the General Assembly, the Economicand Social Council and organizations of the United Nations system which call for action by, or are of relevance to the United Nations Development Programme and its Governing Council.

For this purpose, the appropriate paragraphs have been quoted. However, in accordance with Governing Council decision 79/14, the texts of resolutions already referred to in the documentation presented to the Council under other items are not reproduced in the documentation under this item. For those resolutions of general interest to the Governing Council and UNDP, only the titles have been given. This is line with General Assembly resolution 2839 (XXVI) of 17 December 1971, which states in paragraph 3(d) that "the texts available in easily accessible documents should not be incorporated in or annexed to reports". Moreover, resolutions and decisions have not been quoted in extenso because of the need to achieve greater brevity as called for in General Assembly decisions on strict limitation of documentation. For the same reason, the resolutions and decisions of the General Assembly on special programmes of economidisaster, humanitarian relief and other assistance have not been reproduced in this document, but are listed.

The paragraphs of the resolutions adopted by the General Assembly and the Economi and Social Council in 1985 regarding UNDP specifically are reproduced in sections I and II. The other resolutions are listed in numerical order by title. Resolutions and decisions adopted by organizations of the United Nations system are contained in the addendum to this document.

40/211. Operational activities for development

- 2. Emphasizes the importance of the round-table country review process and other mechanisms for co-ordination at the country level in facilitating the effective implementation of the development programmes in the countries concerned;
- 3. Takes note of the report of the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme for the year 1985 and the decisions contained therein.
- 4. Reaffirms the central funding role of the United Nations Development Programme in the field of technical co-operation for development;
- 6. Expresses its deep concern about the shortfall of resources of the United Nations Fund for Population Activities and the impact on its ability to carry out its planned programmes and urges all countries to continue and increase their support for the Fund;

6. Requests the United Nations Development Programme to increase its efforts to mobilize additional resources for refugee-related development projects and, in general, to promote and co-ordinate with the host countries and the donor community the integration of refugee-related activities into national development planning;

Requests the Secretary-General, in accordance with the Declaration and Programme of Action, to monitor, in consultation and close co-operation with the Organization of African Unity, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees and the United Nations Development Programme, the follow-up of the Conference;

40/122. International Conference on Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking

Decides to convene, in 1987, an International Conference on Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking at the ministerial level at the Vienna International Centre as an expression of the political will of nations to combat the drug menace, with the mandate to generate universal action to combat the drug problem in all its forms at the national, regional and international levels and to adopt a comprenhensive multidisciplinary outline of future activities which focuses on concrete and substantive issues directly relevant to the problems of drug abuse and illicit trafficking.

40/446. Closure of the Fund for the United Nations Relief Operations in Bangladesh and of the Trust Fund Programme for the Republic of Zaire

The General Assembly, having taken note of decision 85/42 of 29 June 1985 of the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme, requested the Secretary-General to take the necessary steps for the closure of the Fund for the United Nations Relief Operations in Bangladesh and of the Trust Fund Programme for the Republic of Zaire and to transfer any balances of these Funds remaining at 31 December 1985 as add-ons to the United Nations Development Programme indicative planning figures of the countries concerned.

40/447. Closure of the Fund of the United Nations for the Development of West Irian and of the United Nations Korean Reconstruction Agency - Residual Assets Fund

The General Assembly, having taken note of decision 85/42 of 29 June 1985 of the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme, requested the Secretary-General to take the necessary steps for the closure as from 31 December 1985 of the Fund of the United Nations for the Development of West Irian and of the United Nations Korean Reconstruction Agency - Residual Assets Fund.

40/448. Closure of the United Nations Special Fund for Land-locked Developing Countries

The General Assembly, having taken note of decision 85/32 of 28 June 1985 of the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme, requested the Secretary-General to take the necessary steps to dissolve the United Nations Special Fund for Land-locked Developing Countries in an orderly manner by 31 December 1986 and to transfer all uncommitted resources to the general resources of the Programme.
