Information on United Nations system regular and extra-budgetary technical
co-operation expenditures in 1985 financed from sources other than UNDP

Report of the Administrator

Summary

The present report is the latest in a series presented to the Governing Council each year since 1973. It responds to decision 81/34, in which the Council requested the Administrator to continue to provide information to it on technical co-operation expenditures for organizations in the United Nations system which are financed from sources other than the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP).

The report is divided into four sections dealing with:

- (a) The coverage of the report and the nature of the data contained in it;
- (b) Characteristics of the 1985 expenditure data provided by the specialized agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA);
- (c) Data on the contributions received by the agencies in support of extra-budgetary technical co-operation activities in 1985; and
- (d) Data which have been made available from other organizations on operational activities in 1985.

Detailed data provided by the United Nations, the specialized agencies and IAEA on their non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures are contained in tables 1-8 of the annex. These data are provided by agency, by sector, by recipient country and by source of financing. The country-by-country estimates of United Nations system expenditures on operational activities in 1985 are contained in table 8 of the annex.

Introduction

1. Since 1973, the Administrator has been providing the Governing Council with an annual report on the magnitude and composition of the technical co-operation activities of the organizations in the United Nations system funded from sources other than UNDP. In 1981, the Council requested, in its decision 81/34,^{1/} that the Administrator continue to provide such data to it, until alternative arrangements for the provision of such data had been made in the United Nations system. Consequently, and in the absence of such arrangements, the present report contains data on the specialized agencies and IAEA in 1985. As in previous years, these entities have co-operated with UNDP in the preparation of this report by providing the data relating to expenditures and contributions contained in the annex. In addition, this report continues the practice of presenting expenditure data made available by two non-technical co-operation bodies, namely the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the World Food Programme (WFP), as well as certain data on disbursements made by the World Bank and the International Development Association (IDA). Sections I and III below contain a brief analysis of these data together with a preliminary overview of the total United Nations system expenditures on operational activities for development in 1985.

2. Six years ago, extensive revisions were made to improve the coverage of the report and to ensure that the data could be used as an input to the annual reports on, as well as the comprehensive policy reviews of, operational activities for the development of the United Nations system presented by the Director-General for Development and International Economic Co-operation (DIEC), as well as to relate the data to those contained in the report of the Secretary-General on United Nations technical co-operation activities, presented each year to the Governing Council. The format used in the presentation of data in this report is essentially the same as was used last year, except that table 1, which used to contain a summary record of technical co-operation expenditures of the United Nations system by executing agencies and the Administrative Committee on Co-ordination (ACC) programme classification categories for the year covered by the report, has been revised to incorporate the figures for the preceding year as well. This has been done to provide ready comparability and to ensure a more accurate accountability of expenditures resulting from the biennial system of budgeting and accounting of one of the organizations in the United Nations system. Additionally, this table has been split into two parts - one part containing information on expenditures by the executing agencies and the other part reflecting expenditures by sectors as per programme classification approved by the ACC.

3. A joint working party of the Consultative Committee for Substantive Questions (Operational Activities) (CCSQ(OPS)) and the Consultative Committee on Administrative Questions (Financial and Budgetary Questions) (CCAQ(FB)), which was convened in December 1980, studied the issue concerning improvement in reporting on United Nations system technical co-operation, particularly with respect to the classification of the operational activities of the United Nations system by type of activity, the classification of their sources of funding and the standardization of agency reporting on expenditures on development co-operation. The working party made a number of proposals relating to the classification of development co-operation activities as well as the possibility of using a single data base for the three cross-organizational expenditure reports currently prepared in the United Nations system (i.e., the present report, the annual report of the Director-General, DIEC, and the ACC report on expenditures in relation to programmes). Further work on this subject was held in abeyance pending the discussion by the Economic and Social Council of a report requested by it in Economic and Social Council resolution 1981/63,^{2/} on the means of enhancing the effectiveness of the co-ordination of information systems in the United Nations system. At its resumed second regular session in 1982, the Economic and Social Council considered a report on these issues prepared by two independent experts and adopted resolution 1982/71.^{3/} This resolution, inter alia, recommended that a small mechanism for the co-ordination of information systems be established which would review and advise on proposals for the creation of new information systems or for the substantial modification of existing ones as well as develop a meaningful register of development activities. At its first session, in September 1983, the ACC Advisory Committee for the Co-ordination of Information Systems (ACCIS) designated a technical panel to carry out such a task and prepare a detailed proposal, which included the preparation of a register of development activities. The panel's report, which included the final design of the register, its scope, problems in its implementation, institutional arrangements, financial implications, etc., was considered by ACCIS and a report thereon, together with an implementation plan, was submitted by ACC to the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination (CPC) for consideration by the Economic and Social Council at its second regular session of 1985. At that session, the Council, in section VII of resolution 1985/76, took note of the Register of Development Activities proposed by ACC in response to Council resolution 1982/71 and General Assembly resolution 37/226 and urged its early implementation; it also invited ACC to proceed with the technical design for the establishment and operation of the Register and to submit a detailed progress report to CPC at its twenty-sixth session, including, inter alia, information on cost, funding, assessment of utility to Member States and agency participation. A prototype system has been developed and is now being demonstrated to Member States and agencies. Pending final outcome of the deliberations in the Economic and Social Council, the Administrator shall continue to provide these expenditure reports.

4. As in previous years, a questionnaire was sent to the participating and executing agencies requesting information on: (a) technical co-operation expenditures against their regular budget and extra-budgetary sources other than UNDP; and (b) contributions received by them in support of these activities. In order to improve the quality and coverage of the data in the present report, as well as to minimize the danger of double-counting of the data, agencies were asked not to provide data on expenditures incurred by them against UNDP-administered funds, and the United Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA), since these data are being obtained from the funding organizations. In those cases where data on such expenditures were reported on, and identified as such, the data made available by the funding organization were substituted for those reported by the agencies.

5. The funding sources, according to the classification scheme agreed to by the agencies in 1979, have been adopted by all agencies. In the case of the World Health Organization (WHO), as it is subject to biennial budgeting and accounting (1984-1985 being the last reporting period), figures reported for 1984 in our last report on this subject (DP/1985/65 of June 1985), represented disbursements made during 1984 and were provisional. Therefore, and following the advice of WHO, the data presented for WHO for 1985 represents exactly half of the total expenditures incurred, and contributions received, during the biennium 1984-85. In order to make a meaningful comparison between non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures in 1984 and those in 1985, it would be necessary to make adjustments in the reported data for 1984 to take into account statistical differences in the data for the two years. For reasons of space, it has not been possible to incorporate, in the various tables of the annex to this report, revised 1984 figures along with those of 1985. However, the summary record of technical co-operation expenditures for 1985 has been amended so as to reflect corresponding figures for 1984. All WHO data reflect criteria for technical co-operation established by its Executive Board and the World Health Assembly. Moreover, the data supplied by WHO include support costs, since the variety of forms of support costs - which can vary from one project to another - makes it difficult for WHO to report expenditures exclusive of support costs. Expenditure data submitted by the International Maritime Organization (IMO) also includes support costs. With respect to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), it continues the practice of reporting regular budget expenditures. However, the data provided by UNESCO under the heading "Regular budget" represents expenditures incurred under that organization's participation programme. As a rule, UNESCO considers that no technical co-operation activities are financed from its regular budget.

I. 1985 REGULAR PROGRAMME AND EXTRA-BUDGETARY TECHNICAL
CO-OPERATION EXPENDITURES FINANCED BY SOURCES OTHER
THAN UNDP

6. An overview of the expenditures on technical co-operation activities of each of the executing agencies is provided in table 1 of the annex and the breakdown thereof by main ACC programme classification category in table 2. As indicated in the preceding section, one summary table, which used to indicate expenditures by executing agencies and ACC programme classification, has been split into two, in order to reflect corresponding figures for 1984, and in some cases revised figures, for better comparability and accurate reporting. However, the basic format continues to be the same as that of last year and distinguishes between expenditures financed from agency regular budgets, agency extra-budgetary sources, UNFPA and UNDP-administered funds, as well as those financed from UNDP central resources. Twenty-five organizations and five regional commissions reported expenditures of almost \$916 million financed from sources other than UNDP central funds in 1985 as against \$841 million originally reported for 1984. After adjusting the 1984 expenditure data as shown in document DP/1986/65 to take into account the statistical differences arising from the WHO biennial budgeting and accounting system, as mentioned earlier, non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures for 1984 amounted to \$904 million (\$841 million as reported in document DP/1985/65 plus \$63 million^{4/}) as compared with \$916 million for 1985. This reflects a modest increase of 1.3 per cent as against an increase of about 7.4 per cent between 1983 and 1984 computed by reference to the adjusted figures for 1984. With data adjusted for WHO expenditures, the regular technical co-operation expenditures have gone up by 5.9 per cent, while those funded by extraordinary sources other than UNDP, UNFPA and UNDP-administered funds decreased by 2.4 per cent. However, UNFPA-financed expenditures went up from \$120 million in 1984 to \$128 million, registering an increase of about 6.7 per cent. Those financed by UNDP-administered funds amounted to \$77 million in 1985 against \$81 million in 1984, reflecting a decrease of about 5 per cent.

7. The share of the five larger agencies, the United Nations, the International Labour Organisation (ILO), the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), UNESCO, and WHO, increased slightly during the year and accounted for some 71 per cent of the total non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures as against 70 per cent for 1984, computed after taking into account the adjusted figures of WHO. Expenditures by the United Nations and ILO increased by almost 13.7 per cent, whereas expenditure by WHO registered an increase of 2.6 per cent. However, in the case of UNESCO, non-UNDP-funded expenditures declined considerably and went down by about 28 per cent: expenditures financed from the regular budget went down from \$8 million in 1984 to \$5.8 million in 1985, while those funded from extra-budgetary sources amounted to \$33.3 million in 1985 as against \$47 million in 1984. WHO continues to have the largest non-UNDP-funded technical co-operation programme, reaching a total of almost \$333 million in 1985, followed by FAO with a figure of \$181 million.

8. As also in the past, the expenditure data for the smaller agencies have not produced any generally valid trends, though their total non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures continued to maintain the upward trend. In previous years, several of the smaller agencies have experienced significant rates of growth in their non-UNDP funded technical co-operation expenditures and most of these agencies continued to maintain this trend during 1985. For example, the expenditures of IAEA and the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) went up by almost 11 per cent. The expenditures of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) went up by about 6 per cent, whereas those of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) and the International Maritime Organization (IMO) went up by about 5.4 per cent and 3.3 per cent respectively. The United Nations Centre on Transnational Corporations (UNCTC), which had observed declining trends in its expenditures during the last three years, reversed the trend and its expenditures for 1985 went up by about 20 per cent over its 1984 expenditures. Contrasting with these increases, non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) decreased by 40 per cent, the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) decreased by 19 per cent, the United Nations Centre for Human Settlements (UNCHS) went down by 16.8 per cent, and the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) by about 11.4 per cent. The International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) saw its expenditures decline by some 2.6 per cent between 1984 and 1985.

A. Sectoral distribution

9. As in past years, because of the relative size of the WHO regular budget, the health sector has had the highest concentration of expenditures not financed by UNDP central resources. This sector accounts for 35.5 per cent of all non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures in 1985, which is about the same as in 1984, when computed by reference to the revised WHO expenditures for 1984. In terms of expenditure, the second most important sector continues to be agriculture, forestry and fisheries, with about \$145 million or some 15.8 per cent of the total expenditure as against \$125 million

reported for 1984. Because UNFPA-funded expenditures are included in the analysis, population is the sector with the third highest expenditure, some \$129 million in 1985 or some 14 per cent of the total grant technical co-operation expenditures as against the reported expenditure of \$123 million for 1984, registering an increase of about 4.9 per cent. Next in importance is the natural resources sector, with some \$61 million, or 6.7 per cent of the total expenditure. Transport and communications accounted for some 4.5 per cent of all regular and extra-budgetary grant expenditures, followed in importance by industry (4.4 per cent), general development issues, policy and planning, (3.6 per cent), employment (2.9 per cent) and science and technology (2.7 per cent).

10. Considering regular budgets alone, expenditures for technical co-operation are concentrated in the health sector because of the large weight of the WHO budget and amounted to US \$212 million accounting for some 71.3 per cent of the total of such expenditures funded from regular budgets. Agriculture, forestry and fisheries, occupying the second place with an expenditure of \$23 million, accounted for some 7.8 per cent, followed by industry (4.2 per cent), general development issues policy and planning (3.8 per cent) and natural resources (3.6 per cent).

11. Technical co-operation expenditures financed from extra-budgetary sources, including those funded by UNFPA and UNDP-administered funds (but excluding those financed by the recipient Governments themselves) continue to reflect a less marked concentration of expenditures in a few sectors. As in previous years, the most important sector financed by these sources is population, with 24.5 per cent, followed in order by health (20.6 per cent), agriculture, forestry and fisheries (17 per cent) and natural resources (7.2 per cent).

12. Unilateral "self-supporting" expenditures (i.e., those expenditures which are financed by the developing countries themselves) are concentrated in the agriculture, forestry and fisheries sector with almost 35.7 per cent of such expenditures, followed by transport and communications (25 per cent). Expenditures on natural resources (13.5 per cent) occupy the third place, while industry is the fourth place (7.6 per cent).

B. Regular budget expenditures

13. Expenditures funded out of regular programme budgets amounted to \$298 million for 1985 as against the adjusted figure of \$281 million for 1984 (see paragraphs 6 and 7 for explanations), resulting in an increase of almost 6 per cent. On the average, agency regular budget expenditures accounted for some 32.5 per cent of total non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures (see tables 1 and 2), as against 31 per cent for 1984 calculated by reference to the adjusted figure. Of the traditional executing agencies (i.e., excluding the development banks, UNDP, UNFPA, UNICEF, NGOs and Governments),

UNCTC, the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE), the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), ICAO, the World Tourism Organization (WTO) and the International Trade Centre (ITC) reported that they had incurred no technical co-operation expenditures financed from their regular budgets. With the exception of UNCHS, UNCTAD, UNESCO, ITU, ECA and the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP), which reported decreased expenditures for 1985, all other agencies incurred expenditures either higher than those for 1984 or almost at the level of 1984. Because of the WHO biennial budgeting and accounting system, their reported expenditure for 1985 corresponds to the adjusted expenditure of \$205 million for 1984 and this agency continues to be the lead agency in terms of technical co-operation funded from the regular budget. FAO, with the second largest regular budget technical co-operation programme after WHO, incurred an expenditure of \$27 million for 1985 as against \$20 million for 1984. UNIDO reported a substantial increase in its expenditures during 1985: \$9 million from \$3.7 million in 1984. The following agencies also indicated increases in their regular programme expenditures; IAEA from \$20 million to \$23 million; ILO from \$8 million to \$10.6 million; United Nations from \$7.3 million to \$7.8 million; Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC) from \$590,000 to \$1.2 million; WIPO from \$1.2 million to \$1.4 million; Economic and Social Commission for West Africa (ESCWA) from \$790,000 to \$930,000 and WMO from \$824,000 to \$1.04 million. In contrast with these increases, UNESCO reported a sizeable decrease in its regular programme expenditure: from \$8 million in 1984 to \$5.8 million in 1985. The following agencies also reported decreased regular programme expenditures: ECA from \$1.8 million to \$1.6 million; UNCHS from \$577,000 to \$321,000; UNCTAD from \$329,000 to \$248,000; ITU from \$342,000 to \$330,000. Other agencies incurred expenditures which were more or less at the level of 1984.

C. Expenditures financed from extra-budgetary sources

14. Following the pattern of previous years, extra-budgetary expenditures financed from United Nations system sources constituted the second largest type of extra-budgetary expenditures and amounted to \$236 million (See annex tables 1 and 3) for 1985, accounting for some 25.8 per cent of the total non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures. However, in order to make a valid comparison with the expenditures incurred during 1984, adjustments in the data must be made for the biennial system of budgeting and accounting of WHO, as mentioned in the preceding paragraphs. With these adjustments made, extra-budgetary expenditures financed from United Nations system sources amounted to close to \$228 million in 1984, as against \$236 million for 1985. Governments and UNDP (the latter comprising expenditures by the Office for Projects Execution (OPE), the United Nations Volunteers (UNV), the United Nations Revolving Fund for Natural Resources Exploration (UNRFNRE), the United Nations Sudano-Sahelian Office (UNSO) and the United Nations Financing System for Science and Technology for Development (UNFSSTD) showed the highest expenditures in this category, with \$45 million and \$35 million respectively, followed by WHO (\$33 million) and the United Nations (\$23 million).

15. Expenditures financed from non-United Nations system multilateral sources amounted to \$21 million for 1985 (see annex tables 1 and 4) against the corresponding figure of \$23 million for 1984, thus registering a drop in expenditures by approximately 8.7 per cent. Amongst the agencies which have incurred expenditures under non-United Nations multilateral sources, FAO continues to be the lead agency, with an expenditure of about \$17 million. Except for ILO, ITU and ECA, all other agencies which have reported expenditures under this detailed head saw a decline in their expenditures during 1985. FAO, which is the lead agency and accounted for almost 81 per cent of 1985 expenditures under non-United Nations multilateral sources, reported an expenditure of \$17 million as against \$18.5 million in 1984. The following agencies also reported decreases in their expenditures under this detailed head: UNIDO from \$220,000 to \$14,000; UNESCO from \$1.9 million to \$1.6 million; WHO from \$472,000 to \$247,000; IAEA from \$22,000 to \$8,000; IMO from \$754,000 to \$118,000 and WIPO from \$193,000 to \$125,000. ICAO reported nil expenditures as against \$62,000 in 1984; ECA and ITU reported substantial increases in its expenditures from \$282,000 to \$624,000 and from \$87,000 to \$177,000 respectively. ILO reported a marginal increase in its expenditure from \$452,000 to \$588,000. However, ITC, UNCHS and WMO reported expenditures of \$175,000, \$64,000 and \$35,000 respectively, as against nil expenditures for 1984.

16. Extra-budgetary expenditures financed from bilateral sources (See annex tables 1 and 5), which comprise expenditures against resources provided directly to the executing agencies by a Government, non-governmental organization, etc., for expenditure in another country or countries, constituted the largest type of non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures. The share of agency expenditures from bilateral resources in the total of regular and budgetary expenditures in 1985 went up to about 30 per cent from 29.6 per cent in 1984, this having been calculated by reference to the adjusted expenditure figures of 1984 to take cognizance of the WHO biennial budgeting and accounting system. In absolute terms, such expenditures amounted to \$275 million for 1985 as against \$268 for 1984, reflecting an overall increase of about 2.6 per cent. Among the agencies with such expenditures, WHO continues to be the most important with an expenditure of \$91 million in 1985 as against \$89 million for 1984 and accounts for some 33 per cent of the total expenditures financed by bilateral sources. FAO, which occupies the second place in terms of expenditures, reported an expenditure of \$76 million as against \$70 million in 1984, and is followed by ILO with an expenditure of \$27 million against a comparable figure of \$24 million for 1984. UNESCO reported an expenditure of \$21 million as against \$17 million for 1984. Though UNIDO reported a drop in its expenditures from \$16 million in 1984 to \$13 million in 1985, it continues to occupy an important position and is followed by ITC (\$8.9 million), IAEA (\$7.9 million) and United Nations (\$7.7 million). WMO reported a substantial drop in its activities and recorded an expenditure of \$4.8 million in 1985 as against \$8.2 million in 1984. Other agencies reported minor variations in their expenditures for 1985 vis-à-vis 1984.

17. Unilateral self-supporting expenditures declined from \$103 million in 1984 to \$85 million in 1985 (see annex table 1, line C-2 and the last column of annex table 8), reflecting a decrease of some 17.5 per cent as against an increase of 12 per cent observed between 1983 and 1984. FAO reported the highest of such expenditures: \$42 million for 1985, which exceeded the 1984 figure of \$39 million by about 7.7 per cent. Though ICAO reported a slightly lower expenditure for 1985 (\$19.6 million as against \$20.1 million for 1984), it replaced UNESCO as the second largest executing agency. ITU reported a substantial increase in its activities under this self-supporting arrangement and recorded an expenditure of \$16.6 million in 1985 as against a corresponding figure of \$2.7 million in 1984. In contrast with these increases, UNESCO reported a big drop in its expenditures: from \$22.8 million in 1984 to \$4.9 million in 1985. UNIDO, UNCTAD, UNCHS, ILO, WMO and IAEA also reported lower expenditures for 1984. However, ECLAC reported an expenditure of \$552,000 in 1985 against nil expenditures for 1984, and 1985 expenditures reported by UN, WHO, IMO and ITC are higher than those for 1984. As in previous years, most of these expenditures continue to be financed by the members of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) with Saudi Arabia and the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya accounting for some 56 per cent of the total expenditures in this category as against 66 per cent in 1984. For reasons of space, the table showing the breakdown by agency of such expenditures is not included in the statistical annex but can be obtained from UNDP upon request.

II. EXTRA-BUDGETARY CONTRIBUTION TO THE SPECIALIZED AGENCIES AND IAEA FOR TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION ACTIVITIES IN 1985

18. For purposes of reporting contributions, agencies were requested to classify the contributions made to them by type, making a distinction between general contributions and unilateral self-supporting contributions, corresponding to that of expenditures. General contributions data are contained in annex table 6, classifying the sources of contributions by country, by United Nations system sources, by non-United Nations system multilateral sources and by other miscellaneous sources. Annex table 7 contains contributions for self-supporting activities.

19. Twenty-one organizations reported general extra-budgetary contributions of \$348 million received in 1985 against the same organizations' receipts of \$377 million in 1984. In addition, various contributions were reported for a number of additional organizations from different funding sources (mostly UNDP-administered funds), raising the total to some \$468 million from \$465 million in 1984. The expenditures financed by UNFPA and UNDP-administered funds are now registered as contributions to the relevant organizations, since such expenditures are in fact paid up during, or shortly following, the year in which they were incurred.

20. General contributions by countries directly to agencies for purposes of technical co-operation expenditures were reported by 21 organizations as

amounting to \$193 million for 1985 as against \$231 million for 1984 and thus declined by almost 16.5 per cent. The United Nations, UNCHS, UNCTC, UNIDO, ECA, ESCAP, ILO, FAO and IAEA reported substantial reductions in their contributions, whereas other agencies reported contributions almost at the level of 1984 or slightly higher. The contribution from the members of the Development Assistance Committee (DAC) of the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) slipped down from \$218 million in 1984 to \$175 million in 1985.

21. A decrease was also registered in contributions from non-governmental organizations: from \$15.6 million received in 1984 to \$13.3 million received in 1985, a decrease of about 15 per cent. With the exception of FAO and WIPO, which reported slightly higher contributions, all other agencies indicated lower or nil contributions for 1985 vis-à-vis 1984. UNESCO reported a substantial reduction in its contribution from \$5.3 million in 1984 to \$3.9 million in 1985. However, ILO and IMO, which reported nil contributions in 1984 indicated contributions of \$166,000 and \$99,000 respectively in 1985.

22. As also observed during the previous years, the second largest source of financing of agency extra-budgetary technical co-operation activities continues to be the United Nations system itself. Agencies reported contributions of \$208 million (see annex table 6(II)(i) and footnotes a and b of the same table) in 1985 as against \$201 million in 1984, which is an increase of about 3.5 per cent as against a decrease of 7 per cent observed between 1983 and 1984.

23. The contributions from non-United Nations multilateral sources for financing agency extra-budgetary technical co-operation activities showed a very slight variation and amounted to \$20.4 million for 1985 as compared with \$20.6 million for 1984.

24. Annex table 7 contains data on the contributions made to the United Nations system for self-supporting technical co-operation activities. Such contributions, which had reached the level of \$121.8 million in 1984, showed a sharp drop during 1985 and amounted to only \$76.7 million - a decline of almost 37 per cent over 1984 contributions. The contributions from Saudi Arabia showed a steep decline from \$66 million in 1984 to \$21.5 million in 1985. The contributions of the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya went down from \$18 million in 1984 to \$13.7 million in 1985, and those of Oman from \$3.2 million to \$1.3 million. However, some countries increased, though marginally in some cases, their contribution to self-supporting technical co-operation activities. FAO continues to be the largest recipient of such funds, though its share went down from \$66.4 million in 1984 to \$30 million in 1985. ICAO also witnessed a reduction in its share from \$22.6 million in 1984 to \$18.8 million in 1985, followed by UNESCO, down from \$8.2 million in 1984 to \$4.7 million in 1985. However, UNIDO received \$10.6 million in 1985 as against \$7.7 million in 1984.

III. ASSISTANCE PROVIDED BY UNDP AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

25. For purposes of comparison, summary data on UNDP expenditures for 1984 and 1985 are reflected in table 1 by executing agencies and in table 2 by economic sectors. Annex table 8 also reflects UNDP project expenditures for 1985 by recipient country. The data for 1984 conform with those in documents DP/1985/5/Add. 1 and Add.3, while the data for 1985 conform with those in documents DP/1986/11/Add. 1 and Add. 3 and are provisional, as indicated in those documents.

26. Total UNDP project expenditures for 1985 amounted to \$564 million as against \$527 million for 1984, reflecting an increase of almost 7 per cent as compared with a decrease of about 5.8 per cent observed between 1984 and 1983. Non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures went up marginally by about 1.2 per cent calculated by reference to the adjusted figure for 1984 (see paragraph 6 and footnote 4) and amounted to \$915 million as compared with the adjusted figure of \$904 million for 1984. Nevertheless, the majority of the agencies continue to have the greater part of their technical co-operation expenditures financed by UNDP. The exceptions to this rule are WHO, WIPO, UNESCO, UNCTC, ITC, ILO, IAEA, FAO, ESCAP, ESCWA, ECLAC and Economic Commission for Africa (ECA).

27. As in previous years, data on World Bank and IDA technical co-operation expenditures have been incorporated into the report (see annex table 8). These data reflect technical co-operation expenditures financed under World Bank loans and IDA credits for the categories "training" and "consultants". Total disbursements under these categories reached almost \$947 million in 1985, and surpassed UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures. However, caution in the use of these data is advised, since they should be used as an indication of the magnitude only and not compared directly with UNDP and agency expenditure data. Apart from the difficulty of deciding what constitutes technical co-operation in World Bank expenditures, these data reflect disbursements against approved loans and credits, rather than grant-financed expenditures, as is the case with agency expenditures.

28. Annex table 8 also contains data on expenditures incurred by two non-technical co-operation bodies, namely UNICEF and WFP. Expenditures by WFP maintained the momentum regained in 1982 and have risen to \$779 million in 1985 - registering an increase of about 14.7 per cent over the 1984 figure of \$679 million. The expenditures by UNICEF grew considerably to about \$278 million in 1985 as compared to the corresponding figure of \$244 million for 1984.

29. The data on operational activities for development by the United Nations system contained in the country-by-country summaries in annex table 8 are to some extent incomplete and in some cases provisional. However, much of the

double-counting present in some of the previous reports has been eliminated. This, together with the more comprehensive coverage of expenditures (including not only specialized agencies and IAEA, but also expenditures incurred by funding organizations themselves as well as Governments and NGOs) has made it possible to present a more accurate picture of the technical co-operation activities of the United Nations system. The total grant assistance provided by the United Nations system which continued at the annual level of \$2.2 billion from 1982 through 1984, regained the level of 1981 and amounted to \$2.4 billion in 1985.

30. Additional data on expenditures on operational activities for development of the United Nations system will be found in the report of the Director-General, DIEC, which will be submitted to the General Assembly in the near future.

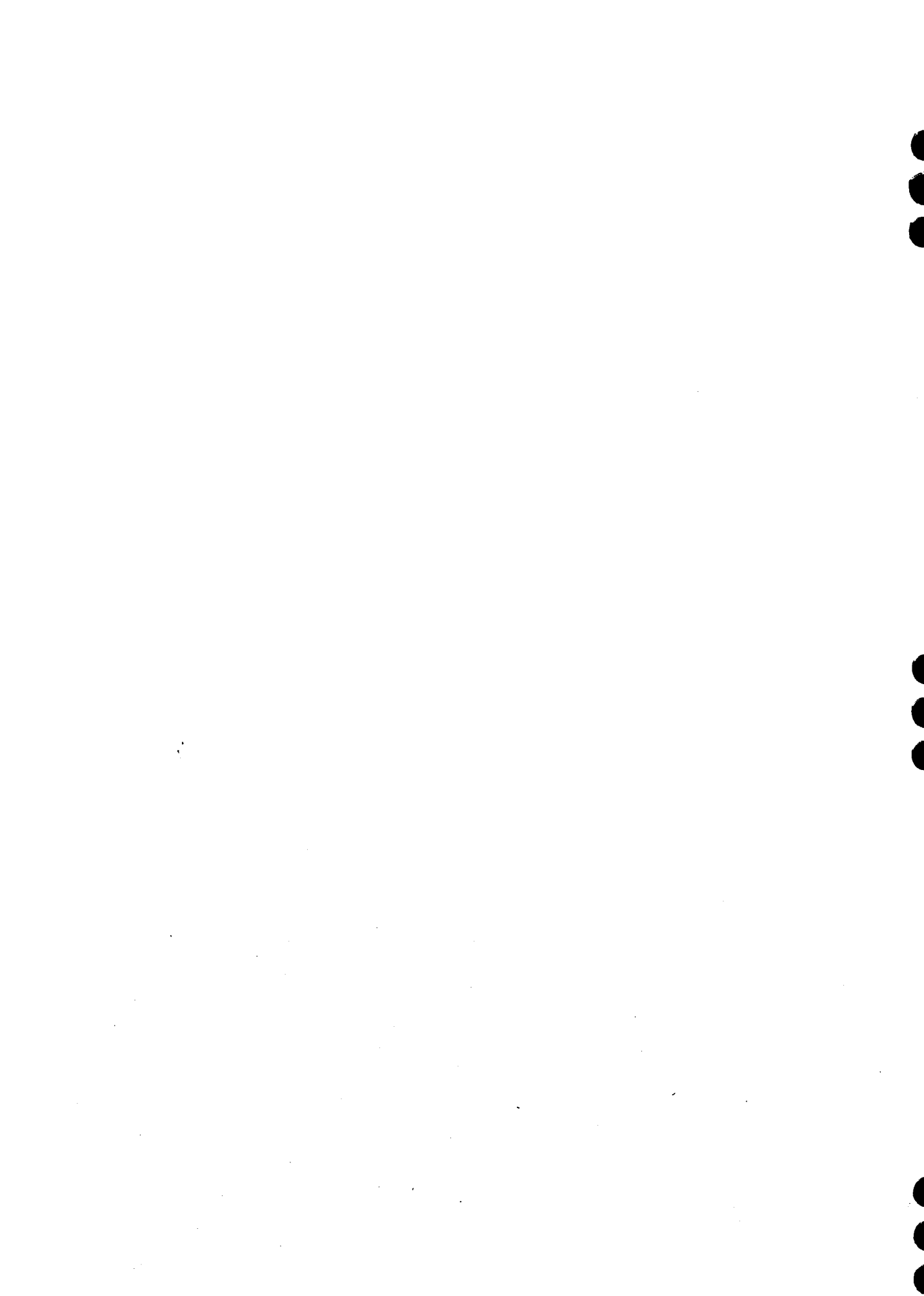
