Draft decision

Women in development

The Governing Council,

Having considered the report of the Administrator on the Annual review of thematic programmes established by the Council (DP/1987/15), and in particular referring to the strategies to promote the role of women in development (WID), and the additional information provided by the Director, Division for Women in Development,

- 1. Notes with appreciation the establishment of the Division for Women in Development, its location in UNDP's organizational structure, and in particular its integration into the senior management level;
- 2. <u>Welcomes</u> information on the positive working climate for the Division for WID in UNDP;
- 3. <u>Emphasizes</u> the strategic importance of a network of focal points for Women in Development at Headquarters as well as at the field offices;
- 4. Notes the fruitful working relationship and complementarity between the new Division and UNIFEM;
- 5. Supports the implementation of the various training activities as planned at Headquarters and at the field level;
- 6. Requests that such training, wherever possible, include agency and Government representatives involved in UNDP-supported programmes and projects;

- 7. Urges the application of WID perspectives in the earliest stages of programme and project design, and a systematic follow-up in all successive stages;
- 8. Approves the Administrator's proposal that genderized data be utilized in planning, monitoring and evaluating all programmes and projects;
- 9. <u>Urges</u> that WID checklists used for the identification, formulation and appraisal of UNDP-supported projects be subject to review and updating by the Division of Women in Development;
- 10. Requests the Administrator to accelerate the recruitment and advancement of women in UNDP, including to senior positions;
- ll. Stresses the need for close co-operation by the Division of Women in Development with relevant units of the United Nations organizations and agencies, as well as Governments and NGOs.
