## I. INTRODUCTION

1. The tables which follow include a summary of statistics on technical cooperation project activities of the organizational entities of the United Nations and detailed information on the Department of Technical Cooperation for Development (DTCD) of the United Nations Secretariat. The information was requested in Governing Council decision 79/22 of 28 June 1979. The present report has been prepared in conjunction with two other reports before the Council at its thirty-eighth session (DP/1991/41/Add.1 and DP/1991/41/Add.2) which contain basic programme data related to work financed by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and information on agency regular budget and non-UNDP extrabudgetary technical cooperation activities. An analysis of the DTCD programme delivery and administrative costs is included in the main text of the present report (DP/1991/41).
2. Financial data for this document have been derived from the financial statements for the year ending 31 December 1990.

## II. PROGRAMME DELIVERY

3. In 1990, the organizational entities of the United Nations delivered a technical cooperation programme of \$277 million, compared with \$250 million in 1989. This represents an 11 per cent increase in project expenditures.
4. Of this amount, DTCD executed a programme of \$180.7 million. Projects financed by UNDP represented \$119.3 million; projects financed by the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) accounted for \$24.6 million; \$25.8 million was financed by trust funds; and \$11.0 million was expended under the United Nations Regular Programme of Technical Cooperation. In comparison with 1989, current year budgets increased by \$15.1 million (7 per cent) in 1990 to \$225.6 million, and the delivery of \$180.7 million was 11 per cent above the previous year's total of \$162.2 million. The implementation rate was 80 per cent.
5. On a geographical basis, the DTCD-executed programme in 1990 included expenditures of \$76.1 million in Africa; \$55.3 million in Asia and the Pacific; \$33.7 million in the Middle East, Mediterranean, Europe and Interregional; and \$15.6 million in the Americas. The largest growth was in Asia, where the programme increased by \$9.1 million. Project delivery in Africa remained the largest, with a 42 per cent share of the total delivery.
6. The distribution of project expenditures by substantive sectors was the following: natural resources and energy, \$70.7 million; development planning, \$32.0 million; statistics, \$28.7 million; public administration and finance, \$26.1 million; population, \$10.4 million; social development, \$5.1 million; the United Nations Educational and Training Programme for Southern Africa (UNETPSA), \$3.9 million; and others, \$3.8 million. Natural resources and energy, which includes work in minerals, energy, water and infrastructure,

comprised 39 per cent of the DTCD total, and remained the largest programme; development planning continued to be second. The largest growth by sector was in natural resources and energy, which increased by \$10.8 million (18 per cent) over the previous year's expenditures.

7. On a component basis, DTCD delivery in 1990 included \$93.8 million for project personnel, \$40.2 million for equipment, \$26.8 million for training, \$10.3 million for subcontracted services and \$9.6 million for miscellaneous expenses. The component which showed the largest growth was personnel, which rose by \$12.1 million. The proportion of total expenditures increased for subcontracts by 56 per cent; personnel by 15 per cent; equipment by 5 per cent, and miscellaneous, 33 per cent; that for training decreased by 6 per cent.

8. Information on participation in the programme, from developing countries and by women, is as follows: equipment purchased in developing countries totalled \$12.4 million or 29 per cent of the total. Of the 1,483 international project personnel serving during the year, 582 or 39 per cent, were from developing countries and 113, or 8 per cent, were female. Of the total of 4,453 training placements made during the year, 2,301 or 52 per cent were for study in developing countries. The trainees themselves numbered 4,065 and of these 755, or 19 per cent, were female.



by Field of Activity**





Fig.3. UN/DTCD Project Expenditures

**Fig.4. UN/DTCD Project Expenditures by Component**






Fig.5. UN/DTCD project personnel:

developing countries






Fig.7. UN/DTC equipment orders :

countries**


