RATIONALIZATION OF THE WORK OF THE GOVERNING COUNCIL

Note by the secretariat

I. INTRODUCTION

1. At its thirty-eighth session (1991), the Governing Council considered the report of the Administrator (DP/1991/58) on biennialization or triennialization of subjects on the agenda of the Governing Council. A draft decision on this subject was presented by Germany and the United States of America (DP/1991/WP.32).

2. In paragraph 1 of its decision 91/51 of 25 June 1991, the Council decided to transmit the text contained in document DP/1991/WP.32 concerning matters relating to the work of the Governing Council for consideration at its organizational meeting in February 1992. In paragraph 2 of decision 91/51, the Council requested the Administrator to forward to the Council at its organizational meeting in February 1992 an updated version of the table of subjects on the agenda in various years contained in paragraph 17 of document DP/1991/58. In paragraph 1 of its decision 91/53 of 25 June 1991, the Council decided to review the provisional agenda for the thirty-ninth session at its organizational meeting in February 1992, within the context of its review of matters relating to the work of the Governing Council.

3. Accordingly, the Governing Council has before it under this item the following:

(a) Document DP/1991/WP.32 containing the draft decision transmitted from the thirty-eighth session;

(b) An updated version of the table of subjects considered by the Council in various years (see section IV below);

(c) The provisional agenda for the thirty-ninth session (DP/1992/L.3).

II. APPEAL FROM THE UNITED NATIONS COMMITTEE ON CONFERENCES
TO THE GOVERNING COUNCIL TO REVIEW ITS MEETING AND
DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS

4. At its 1991 substantive session, held from 19 to 22 August 1991, the Committee on Conferences considered a report from the Secretary-General (A/AC.172/145) on meetings of organs and programmes not funded from the regular budget of the United Nations. The Committee on Conferences, in view of the substantial amount of conference servicing provided for UNDP, appealed to the Governing Council of UNDP to review its meeting and documentation requirements, in the light of the significant financial implications.

5. This question was discussed further at the forty-sixth session of the General Assembly. The outcome of the deliberations in the Fifth Committee will be communicated orally to the Council during the discussion of this item.

6. The Governing Council may therefore wish to review its meeting and documentation requirements, following the appeal of the Committee on Conferences and taking into account the discussion and any resolutions adopted at the forty-sixth session of the General Assembly on this matter.

III. PREVIOUS DECISIONS TAKEN BY THE GOVERNING COUNCIL
REGARDING BIENNIALIZATION OR TRIENNIALIZATION

A. High-level debate

7. By its decision 91/1 of 22 February 1991, the Governing Council decided, on an experimental basis, to dispense with the general debate in budget years (odd years), beginning in 1991, thereby making a three-week session possible. The Council also agreed that the objective to have a high-level segment dedicated to major policy reviews by the Governing Council remains valid and that the high-level policy reviews take place every even year.

8. At its thirty-eighth session (1991), the Governing Council, in paragraph 2 of its decision 91/53 of 25 June 1991, decided that the policy review item to be considered at the high-level segment of its thirty-ninth session (1992) shall be the annual report of the Administrator for 1991 and the priority areas identified therein.

B. Specific subjects

9. In paragraph 3 (f) of section I of decision 81/37 of 27 June 1981, the Governing Council decided to conduct a broad policy review of other funds and programmes under its supervision biennially. In paragraph 2 of section III of its decision 87/1, and in paragraphs 1 and 2 of section A of the annex, the Governing Council approved on an experimental basis the biennialization of reports of the special funds administered by UNDP other than UNIFEM. It was also decided that reports concerning matters on which consensus was not

achieved at previous sessions, relating to amendments of the financial regulations of UNDP, would be taken up biennially.

10. At the organizational meeting for 1991, the Governing Council, by its decision 91/1, indicated its willingness to continue its practice, when drafting decisions, to consider carefully in each case, when the request for a report is made, the possibilities for biennialization or even triennialization.
