EXTENSION OF THE SECOND COUNTRY PROGRAMME FOR ZIMBABWE

Note by the Administrator

- 1. The second country programme for Zimbabwe covers the period 1987 to 1991. The Government has requested a one-year extension of the second country programme so that the new programme could take into consideration the results and recommendations of the first consultative group meeting in February 1992, wherein the Government's external assistance requests and donor commitments in support of its five-year economic reform programme are expected to be announced. The objectives of the second country programme, namely, to expand the economy through raising the standard of living of the population, increasing employment opportunities and human resources development, maintaining a correct balance between environment and development, while developing science and technology, will continue to remain valid for the period of the programme extension.
- 2. It is expected that the third country programme for Zimbabwe will be submitted for approval to the Governing Council in February 1993.
- 3. The Administrator wishes to inform the Council that he has approved the extension of the second country programme for Zimbabwe for a period of one year beginning 1 January 1992.
