I. INTRODUCTION

1. The tables which follow include a summary of statistics on technical cooperation project activities of the organizational entities of the United Nations and detailed information on the Department of Economic and Social Development (DESD) of the United Nations Secretariat. The information was requested by the Governing Council in its decision 79/22 of 28 June 1979. The present report has been prepared in conjunction with other reports before the Council at its fortieth session that contain basic programme data related to work financed by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and information on agency regular budget and non-UNDP extrabudgetary technical cooperation activities. An analysis of the DESD programme delivery and administrative costs is included in the main text of the present report.
2. Financial data for the present document have been derived from the financial statements for the year ending 31 December 1992.
3. In 1992, the organizational entities of the United Nations delivered a technical cooperation programme of \$243 million, compared with \$285 million in 1991. This represents a 15 per cent decrease in project expenditures.
4. Of this amount, DESD executed a programme of \$140.7 million. Projects financed by UNDP represented \$87.2 million; projects financed by the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) accounted for \$14.1 million; \$28.7 million was financed by trust funds; and \$10.7 million was expended under the United Nations Regular Programme of Technical Cooperation.
5. On a geographical basis, the DESD-executed programme in 1992 included expenditures of \$61.9 million in Africa; \$34.6 million in Asia and the Pacific; \$37.6 million in the Middle East, Mediterranean, Europe and on interregional programmes; and \$6.6 million in the Americas. Project delivery in Africa remained the largest, with a 39 per cent share of the total delivery.
6. The distribution of project expenditures by substantive sectors was the following: natural resources and energy, \$47.3 million; development policy, \$28.7 million; statistics, \$16.7 million; public administration and finance, \$25.3 million; population, \$7.6 million; social development, \$4.5 million; the United Nations Educational and Training Programme for Southern Africa (UNETPSA), \$5.8 million; and others, \$4.8 million. Natural resources and energy, which includes work in minerals, energy, water and infrastructure, comprised 34 per cent of the \$140.7 million total, and remained the largest programme; development policy continued to be second, followed by public administration with 20 per cent and 18 per cent respectively.
7. On a component basis, DESD delivery in 1992 included \$83.9 million for project personnel, \$19.8 million for equipment, \$21.2 million for training, \$8.8 million for subcontracted services and \$7.0 million for miscellaneous expenses.
8. Information on participation in the programme from developing countries and by women is as follows: equipment purchased in developing countries totalled \$10 million or 44 per cent of the total. Of the 1,393 international project

personnel serving during the year, 586, or 42 per cent, were from developing countries and 140, or 10 per cent, were female. Of the total of 3,438 training placements made during the year, 1,481, or 43 per cent, were for study in developing countries. The trainees themselves numbered 3,405 and of these 730, or 21 per cent, were female.

Figure 1. DESD project expenditures by source of funds, 1992

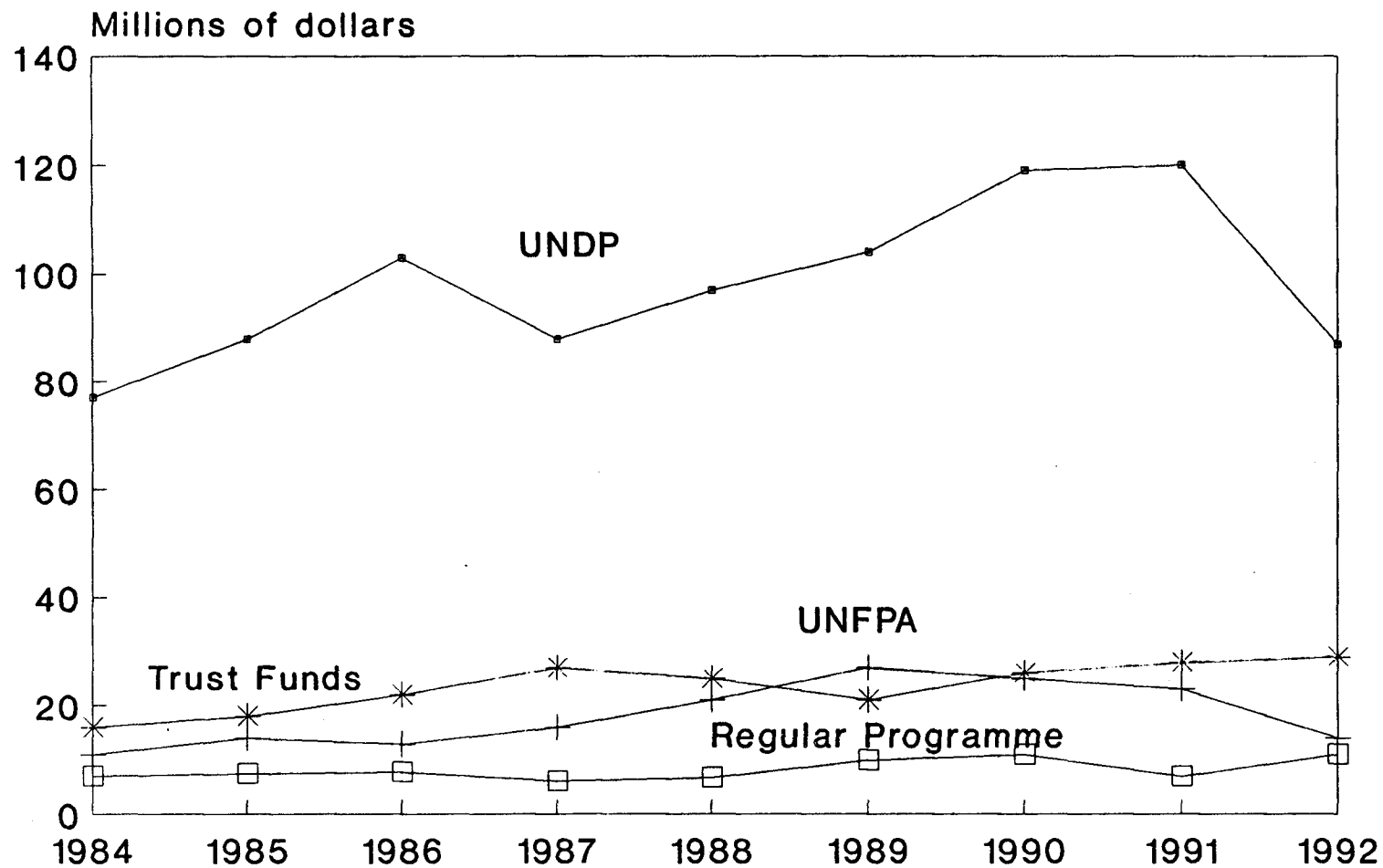


Figure 2. DESD project expenditures by field of activity, 1992

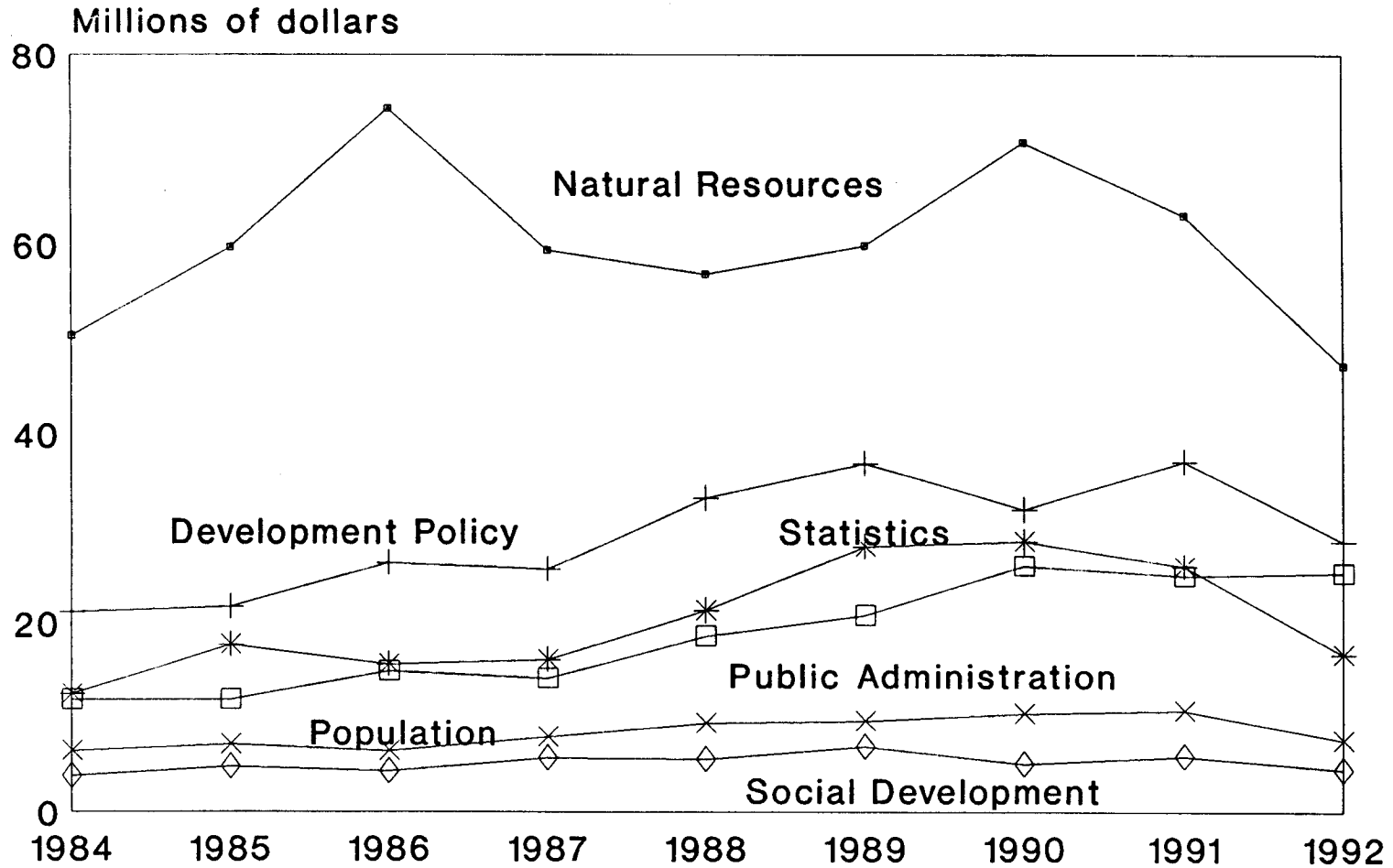
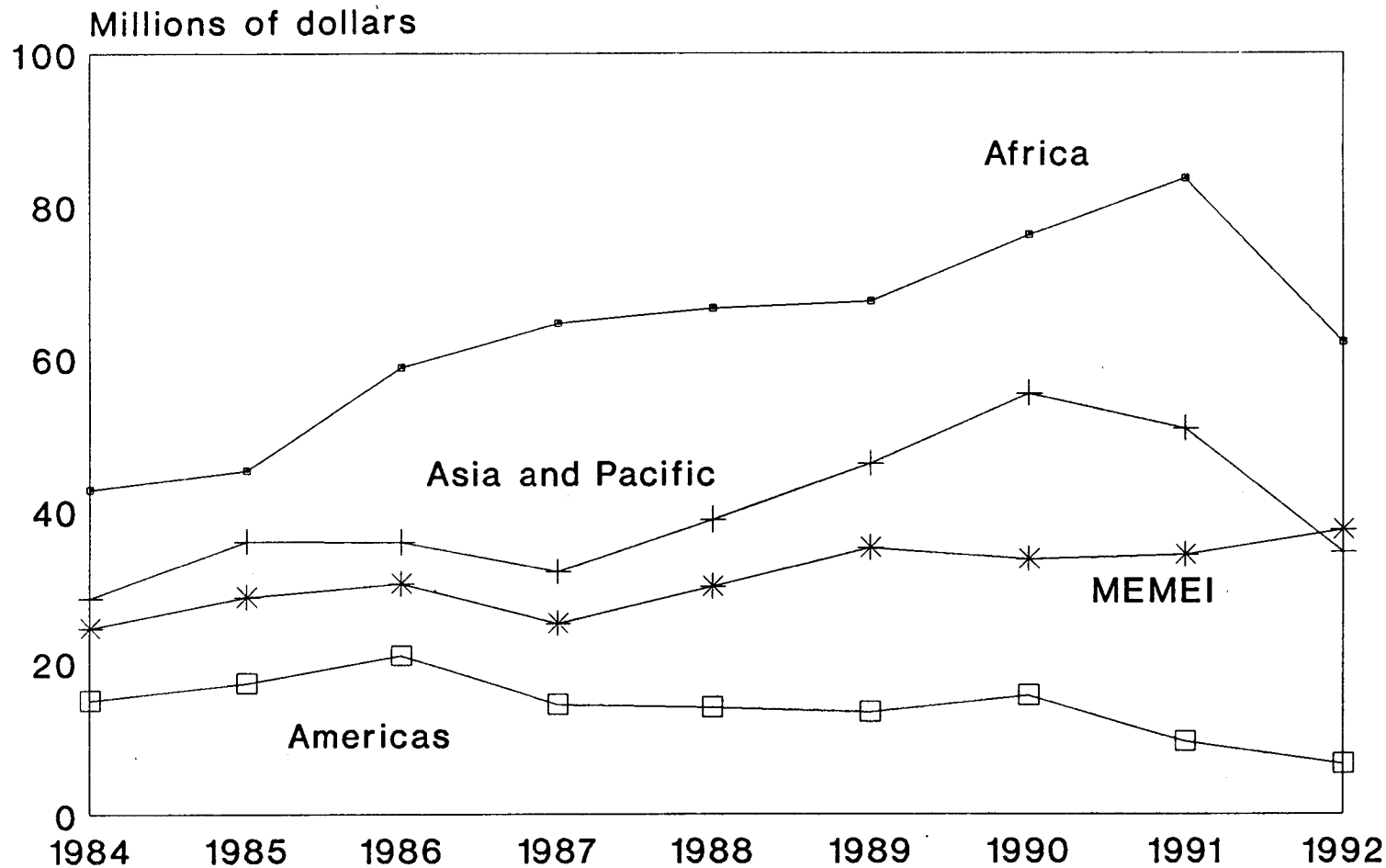


Figure 3. DESD project expenditures by region, 1992

Figure 4. DESD project expenditures by component, 1992

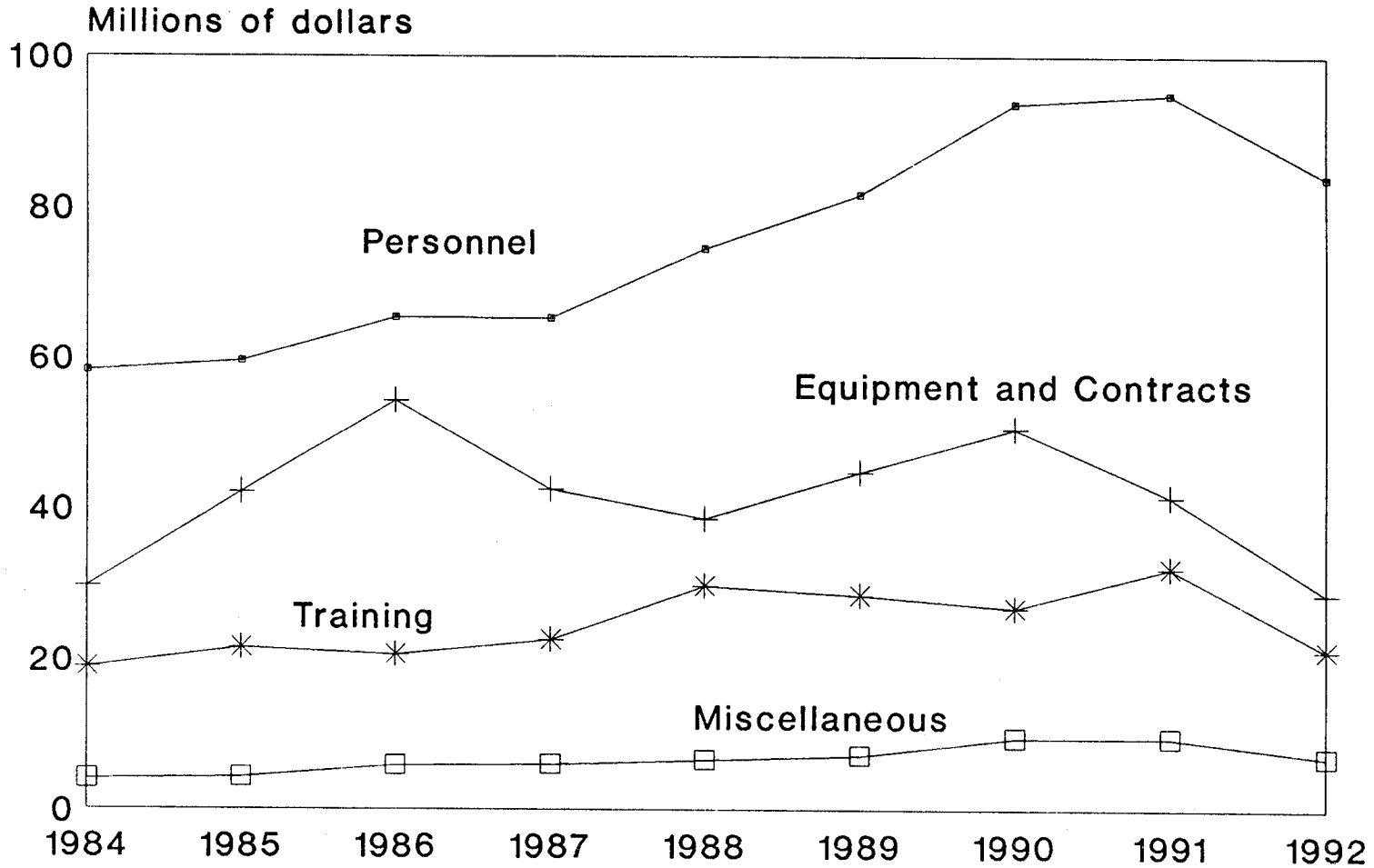


Figure 5. DESD project personnel: proportion of international recruits from developing countries, 1992

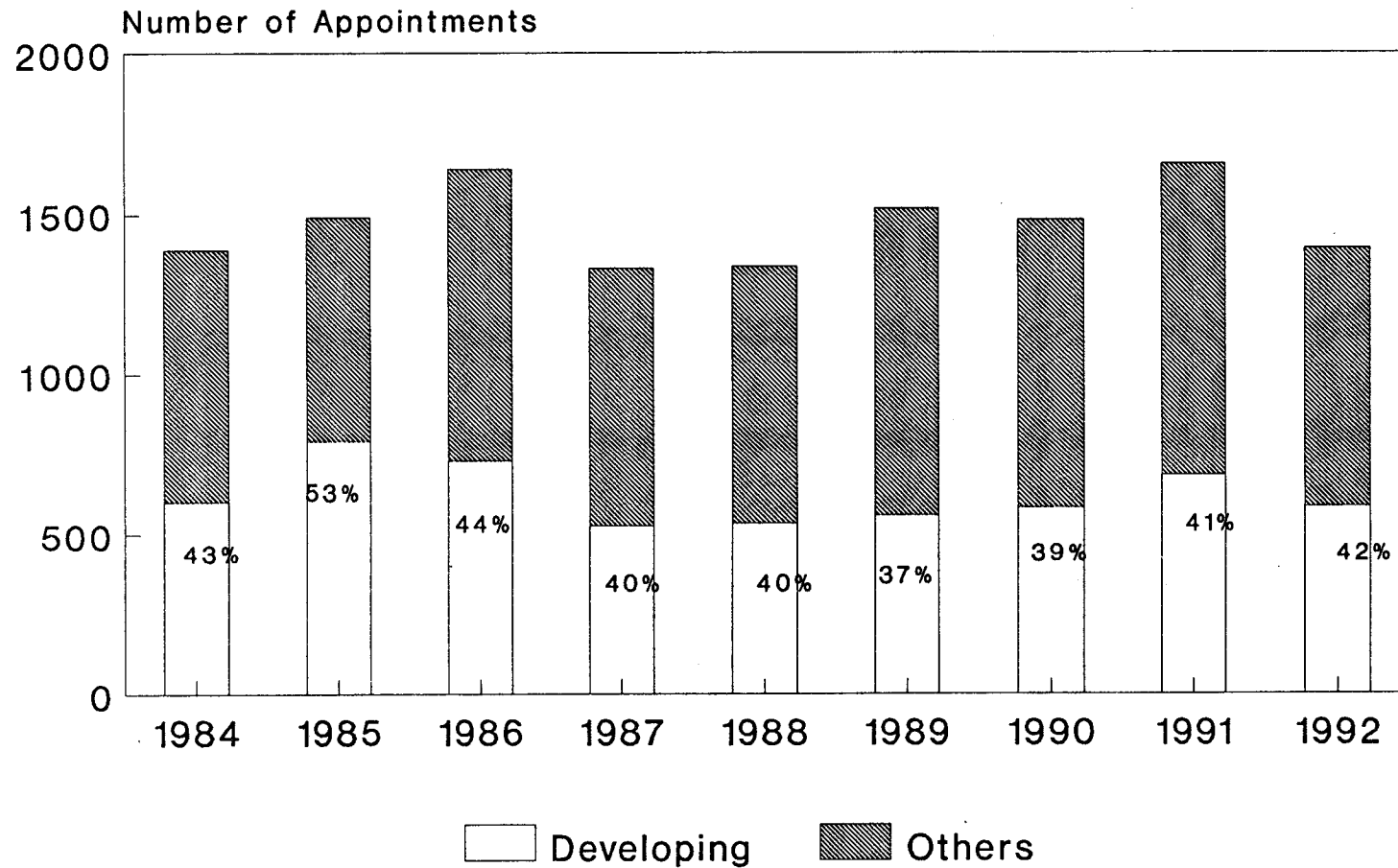
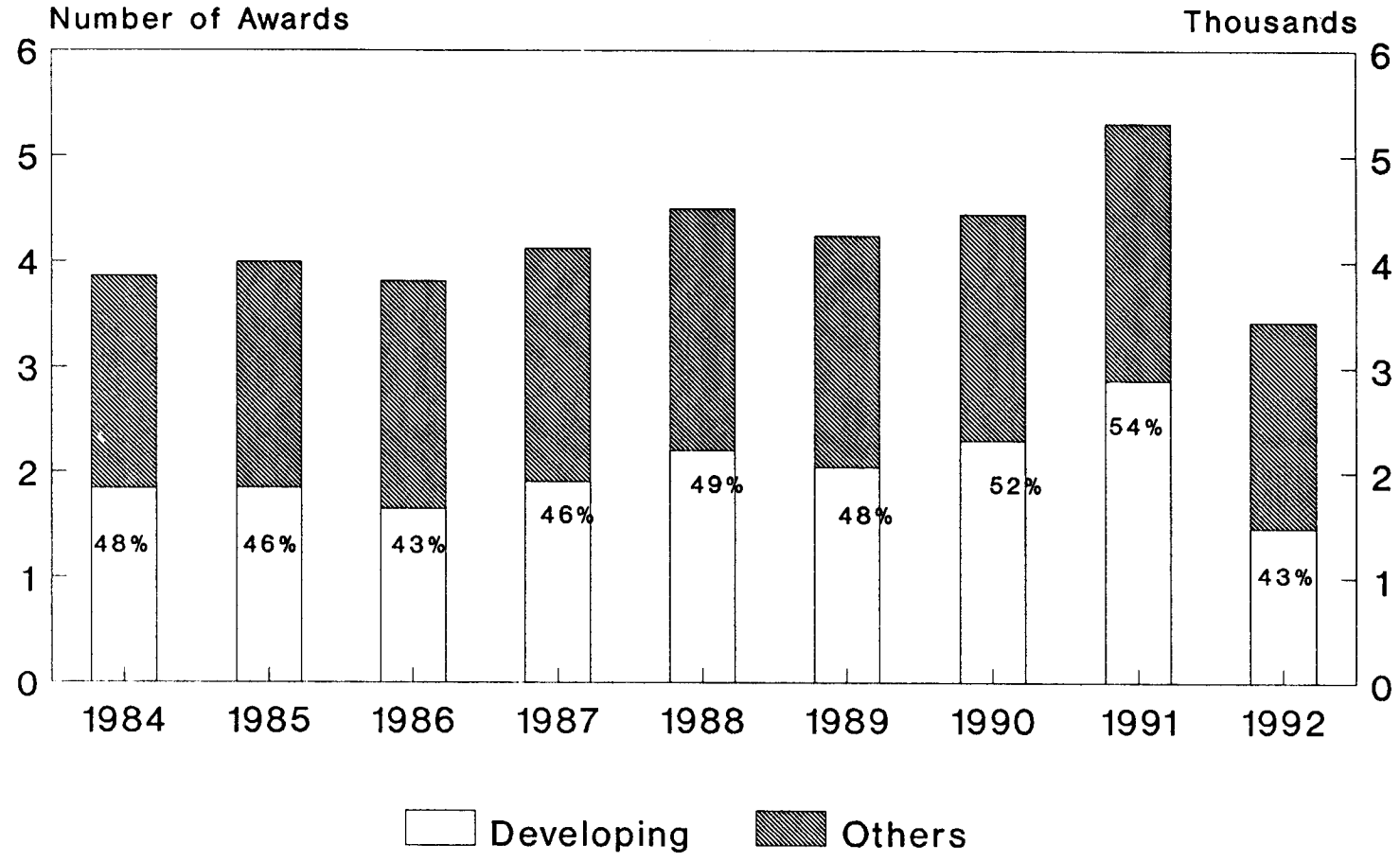


Figure 6. DESD training placements: proportion of host sites in developing countries, 1992



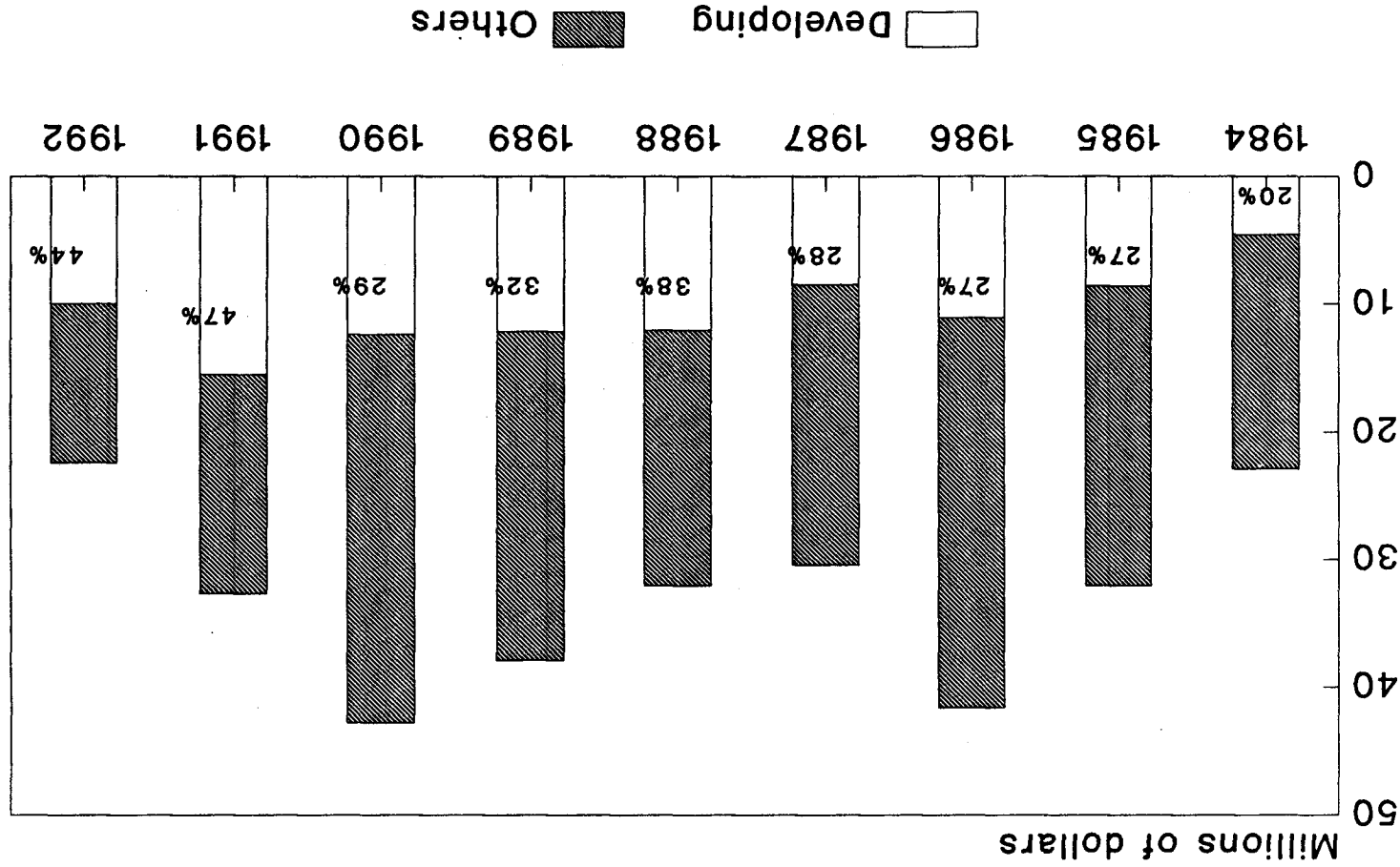


Figure 7. DESD equipment orders: proportion placed in developing countries, 1992
