Note by the Administrator

SUMMARY

The present note provides additional detailed information on, inter alia, attendance and actual costs of holding sessions at Geneva or in New York, as requested by the Governing Council in paragraph 2 of its decision 92/41 of 26 May 1992.

The Governing Council decided in paragraph 3 of its decision 92/41 to transmit the texts contained in documents DP/1992/L.5/Rev.1 and DP/1992/L.22 for consideration at its fortieth session. For easy reference, these two draft decisions are reproduced in annex I and II to the present note.

INTRODUCTION

1. In its decision 92/41 of 26 May 1992, the Governing Council decided to review the issue of the venue of sessions of the Council at its fortieth session and to that effect include in its provisional agenda for the fortieth session an item called "Venue of sessions of the Governing Council".
2. In paragraph 2 of decision 92/41, the Governing Council requested the Administrator to provide additional detailed information on, inter alia, attendance and actual costs of holding sessions at Geneva or in New York and invited the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (ACABQ) to report thereon to the Governing Council at its fortieth session.
3. The additional information requested by the Governing Council is provided in the present note. The comments of ACABQ will be provided separately to the Council when available.
4. In paragraph 3 of decision 92/41, the Governing Council decided to transmit the texts contained in DP/1992/L.5/Rev.1 and DP/1992/L.22 for consideration at its fortieth session. The two draft decisions are reproduced in annex I and II to the present note.
5. Reference is made to the note by the Administrator prepared for the thirty-ninth session (DP/1992/49), which contained detailed background information on the question of venue of sessions of the Governing Council.

I. ATTENDANCE

6. Information regarding attendance during Governing Council sessions 1988-1992 is set out in annex III to the present note. The source of this information is the list of representatives to sessions of the Governing Council in the period 1988-1992, as contained in the following documents: DP/1988/INF/4/Rev.3, DP/1989/INF/2, DP/1990/INF/2/Rev.1, DP/1991/INF/4 and DP/1992/INF/6.

II. BUDGETARY REVIEW

A. Incremental costs to UNDP of the Governing Council

7. Information was provided in document DP/1992/49 on the estimated incremental costs to UNDP of the 1992 Governing Council session in Geneva. An ex post facto review identified additional incremental costs to UNDP of \$33,275. The incremental costs of the Geneva session are set out in annex IV to the present note.

B. Conference-servicing costs

8. At the request of UNDP, the Office of Programme Planning, Budget Division, of the United Nations has provided apportioned actual expenditures based on

actual workload for the sessions of the Governing Council in 1991 (New York) and Geneva (1992). The results of the cost apportionment are shown in the two tables in annex V. Table 1 shows a comparison between the costs of the Governing Council in 1991, when its regular session was held in New York, and in 1992, when its regular session was held in Geneva. Table 2 shows the distribution of the 1992 costs between New York and Geneva.

9. In responding to UNDP's request, the United Nations attempted to apportion the costs of the Governing Council sessions in 1991 and 1992 as a percentage of total actual expenditures based on actual workload. As statistics are not kept by session, the costs cover all sessions of the Governing Council during the respective years. The costs shown for Geneva relate to the costs of interpretation and in-session documentation of the regular session of the Governing Council in 1992. The costs of pre-session documentation for the 1992 session held in Geneva are part of New York costs since pre-session work in 1992 was done mainly in New York. New York costs in 1992 also include the costs of the 1992 organizational and special sessions.

Reaffirming General Assembly resolution 45/264 of 13 May 1991, in particular paragraph 3 (h) of the annex thereto,

Having considered the question of the venue of the Governing Council,

Decides to inform the General Assembly, through the Economic and Social Council, that the Governing Council convenes its meetings only in the location of the United Nations Development Programme headquarters, namely New York, from 1993 onwards, unless it is decided specifically to meet at other places.

Also recalling Governing Council decision 89/63 of 30 June 1989,

Having considered the question of the venue of the Governing Council,

Awaiting the outcome of the debate initiated by General Assembly decision 46/465 of 20 December 1991 on strengthening of the work of the United Nations in the field of operational activities,

Decides to continue to hold its regular sessions alternately at United Nations Headquarters in New York and at the United Nations Office at Geneva in accordance with rule 1 of its rules of procedure.
