1982-1986	\$15.0 million

1. In accordance with Governing Council decision 81/16, requesting the Administrator to ensure the delivery of technical co-operation projects to the fullest extent of the 1982-1986 illustrative indicative planning figures (IPFs), subject to the overriding requirement of containing expenditures within the financial resources available at any given time, the Administrator has requested Governments to programme UNDP technical cooperation up to 80 per cent of their respective illustrative IPFs.

2. The amount of programmed resources in the third country programme (DP/CP/IRQ/3) submitted by the Government of Iraq is \$15,898,000, or \$1,898,000 in excess of the \$14 million available for programming after deduction of 20 per cent of the 1982-1986 illustrative IPF for Iraq and addition of the carry-over from the second cycle IPF. The Government of Iraq, in its country programme document, has given assurances that in case the available UNDP resources are insufficient to meet the Government's technical co-operation requirements, the Government will provide the necessary additional funds through cost-sharing. 2/

3. The Administrator will ensure that approval of assistance under the Iraq country programme will meet the requirements of the Governing Council's decision referred to above, taking into consideration the level of additional resources which will be available for that country programme under cost-sharing.
