COUNTRY AND INTERCOUNTRY PROGRAMMES AND PROJECTS

Resources taken into account for programming

Note by the Administrator

Summary

The country and intercountry programmes covering years of the third IPF cycle which were approved by the Governing Council at its sessions in June 1981 and May 1982 were all prepared taking into account resources for programming calculated at 80 per cent of the illustrative IPFs for 1982-1986. The same is true of programmes being submitted to the Council at its special meeting in February 1983. Following the decision to reduce 1982-1986 programme levels to 55 per cent of the illustrative IPFs, this paper shows the revised resource framework for the programmes already approved and for those being submitted to the February meeting. The Council is requested to take note of the actions taken and of the reduced resource levels for these programmes.

1. By its decision 80/30, eperative paragraph 4(a), the Governing Council decided that, if mobilization of resources fell short of the target for the third IPF cycle, "...there would be a flat across-the-board percentage reduction in the IPFs of all countries in supersession of any criteria that may interfere with the share of the respective countries;". 1/ In operative paragraph 4(b), this principle was extended also "...to other uses of financial resources...subject to the Administrator making a more precise estimate of the UNDP administrative budget in the light of resources that may become available;". 2/

- 2. By the same decision, operative paragraph 7(b), the Governing Council authorized the Administrator "to work out the IPFs for each country which shall be available to such countries for programming purposes on the basis of the estimate of resources resulting from the discussions referred to in paragraph (a) above, including, if necessary, the application of the provisions of paragraph 4(a) above, and to notify each country accordingly;". 3/
- 3. In August 1980, the Administrator issued instructions which required that for country and intercountry programmes to be submitted to the June 1981 session of the Governing Council, IPF resources to be taken into account for programming in respect of 1982-1986 should not exceed 80 per cent of the illustrative IPF for 1982-1986.
- 4. By decision 81/16, 4/ operative paragraphs 3(a) (c), the Governing Council confirmed the third cycle country, intercountry and unallocated illustrative indicative planning figures as approved by the Governing Council in its decision 80/30 and approved some new and revised third cycle illustrative IPFs. It also reiterated the requirement that expenditures must be always contained within the financial resources available at any given time, so as to preserve the financial integrity of the Programme.
- 5. Country and intercountry programmes submitted to the Governing Council in June 1981 and May 1982 were all prepared with resources for programming calculated 80 per cent of the illustrative IPFs for 1982-1986. However, the Administrator informed the Governing Council, at its June 1982 session, that current resource projections would allow UNDP to deliver only approximately 60 per cent of the 1982-1986 illustrative IPFs, and that he had, therefore, taken measures to reduce the 1982 and 1983 IPF programmes to levels commensurate with projected resources for these years.
- 6. Since then, the situation has deteriorated further, with anticipated voluntary contributions for 1983 estimated to show little or no increase, compared to 1982. Projected resources would now allow a delivery of only approximately 55 per cent of the illustrative IPFs for 1982-1986. The Administrator has, therefore, decided to limit the resources to be taken into account for programming to this level. In view of the lengthy consultations and sectoral reviews that have taken place in the preparation of the country programmes now submitted to the Council for approval, and considering that in many cases these programmes have been formally endersed at the Cabinet level, the Administrator has decided not to attempt to renegotiate these programmes. Instead, he has chosen to present to the Council the attached tables which demonstrate the impact of the resource reductions on the country programmes for the third IPF cycle, approved in June 1981 and May 1982, and on those submitted for approval to the February 1983 special meeting of the Council.
- 7. In addition, in accordance with current instructions, the country programmes now under preparation for submission to the Governing Council in June 1983 are based on resources amounting to 80 per cent of the illustrative IPFs for 1982-1986. Due to the advanced stage of preparation of many of these programmes, it has not been feasible to revise their resources base. They will, therefore, be presented to the Council together with a note similar to this, showing the resource implications of the reduction in the programme levels.

- 8. The attached tables show the resources taken into account, based on 80 and 55 per cent of the illustrative IPFs for 1982-1986 respectively, compared to the amounts programmed for engoing and new projects and the amounts that have been earmarked by sector.
- 9. For those programmes that were approved in 1981 and 1982, it is likely that commitments for engoing projects have since increased and that additional commitments have been made for new projects. Therefore, although, in most cases, reductions can be achieved through cancelling sectoral earmarkings and eliminating proposals for new projects, there are some countries where engoing projects may also be affected if alternative financing cannot be arranged through cost sharing. Needless to say, these measures will remove the flexibility built into the programmes through the principle of programming by objectives. Further, from a substantive point of view, the advantages of continuous programming will largely be lost and, with it, the ability to respond to changing development needs.
- 10. Although this note is primarily intended to keep the Council informed about the consequences of these reductions, the Administrator would appreciate the Council taking note of the actions which he has taken based on the imperative need to safeguard the financial integrity of the Programme as directed by the Council.

Technical note for tables 1-3

Resources presented in country programmes

Where the programme period coincides with the IPF period (1982-1986) the amount reflected here is 80 per cent of the illustrative IPF, sometimes adjusted for an estimated balance of IPF resources from the second IPF cycle.

Where the programme period differs from the IPF period, adjustment has been made for programming levels, in effect at that time, for non-coinciding years.

Other: Project or programme cost sharing agreed or under negotiation, Special Measures Fund for Least Developed Countries or provision for adequate programming.

Current projection of resources

IPF: 55 per cent of illustrative IPF for 1982-1986 adjusted for any balance from second cycle and/or expenditures or programming levels for years different from IPF period.

Other: As shown in the country programmes, except for the elimination of provision for adequate programming.
