Annotations to the provisional agenda

1. Adoption of the agenda and organization of work.

In accordance with decisions 83/5, section III.A and 86/23, the Council may again wish to resolve itself into the Committee of the Whole when dealing with item 2.

Since the last meeting of the Committee of the Whole in June 1986, its Working Group will have held two sessions, one in September 1986 and one in February 1987 immediately preceding the organizational meeting and special session of the Council. As a new membership and chairman of the Working Group will have been elected at the Council's organizational meeting for 1987 in accordance with decision 86/1, it may also be appropriate that the outgoing Chairman of the Working Group make his statement to the Committee of the Whole reporting on the Group's work as prescribed by decision 86/1, paragraph (j). The Committee of the Whole may wish to hear this statement at the beginning of its deliberations.

2. Programme planning: country and intercountry programmes and projects.

(a) Trends and problems in the country programmes.

The Council will have before it a report of the Administrator in which are reviewed 28 country programmes being submitted to the special session of the Governing Council for consideration and approval. The report is organized in a format similar to that used for the reports submitted to the earlier sessions of the Council.

(b) Consideration and approval of country programmes (including extension).

Rule 4 of the rules of procedure of the Governing Council stipulates that meetings or portions thereof at which proposed country and intercountry programmes and projects are considered shall normally be held in private unless otherwise decided by the Governing Council. This rule notwithstanding, the Governing Council decided at each session since its twenty-fourth session to suspend this rule and to consider country programmes in open meetings, with the understanding that at any time a member of the Council may request that rule 4 be applied.

The Council may therefore wish to decide whether to proceed in accordance with this practice.

Twenty-eight country programmes are being submitted for consideration and approval by the Council. A note by the Administrator accompanies those programmes whose resources for the third programming cycle, 1982-1986, including illustrative indicative planning figures and planned cost-sharing, amount to \$10 million or more, or where there are specific issues which the Administrator wishes to bring to the attention of the Council.

The Council will further have before it, for information, a note by the Administrator on one country programme which has been extended by the Administrator in accordance with the revised procedures contained in document DP/518 and Corr.1, which the Council endorsed by its decision 81/15.
