PROGRAMME PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION

Tentative timetable for mid-term reviews 1993-1995

1. The present report is in response to Governing Council decision 92/28 of 26 May 1992, in which the Council requested the Administrator "to submit to the Governing Council at its special session in 1993 a tentative timetable for the various mid-term reviews to be carried out in the years 1993-1995, together with his proposals on how he will report on the outcomes of the reviews, bearing in mind decision 89/11 of 24 February 1989".

Tentative timetable

2. According to the timetable for the mid-term reviews of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) country programmes for the fifth programming cycle as at 11 November 1992 (see annex), those to be held in the first half of each year beginning in 1993 will be reported on to the Governing Council at its February session in the following year. Those to be held in the second half of each year will be reported on to the Council at its regular session in the following year. This timetable for reporting to the Council is dictated by the lead time required for preparing Council documentation.

Overview reports

3. The Administrator will provide the Governing Council with an overview of all country programme mid-term reviews carried out before the particular session or meeting of the Council. The focus of the overviews will be on the main findings and results of the different reviews, encompassing issues of substance as well as management. The preliminary impact of country programmes will be examined, including the appropriateness of the programmes in the light of current economic, political and social conditions. There will be a summary

of major problems experienced in the implementation of the programmes and a brief analysis of the four issues identified by the Council in its decision 92/28:

"(a) Levels of national execution, together with experience gained;

(b) United Nations Development Programme assistance in national capacity-building at the policy and programme formulation, management and evaluation levels;

(c) Experience with the new support costs arrangements, including problems encountered in their implementation;

(d) Experience with the programme approach, including the use of alternative programme support mechanisms and the extent to which it has changed the focus of the country programme."

4. The overviews will contain an analysis of the comparative advantages of UNDP and the support given to Governments for aid coordination in the countries concerned. They will also provide summary financial data on commitments against, and expenditures of indicative planning figures (IPFs).

Reports on individual mid-term reviews

5. The Administrator will provide the Governing Council with the mid-term review reports of country programmes which have undergone major changes or which the Administrator was explicitly requested to resubmit to the Council at mid-term.

6. In the spirit of Governing Council decision 89/11 of 24 February 1989 on the mid-term review of fourth cycle country programmes, the Administrator proposes initially to submit a representative selection of between two and six country programme mid-term review reports other than those mentioned in paragraph 5 above, depending on the number of reports to be considered at any given session or meeting.
